Indulgences during the Sacred Triduum

The faithful who are present at the Office of Tenebrae on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of Holy Week, and follow the Psalms and Lessons, either by reading them devoutly or with pious meditations on the passion of Our Lord, or other prayers according to each one's capacity may gain a partial indulgence, under the usual conditions, on each of these days or a plenary indulgence, under the usual conditions, if they are present at this devout exercise on all three days.

On Holy Thursday and Good Friday, all who pay a visit to the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose, and pray there the *Our Father*, *Hail Mary* and *Glory be*, five times to thank Our Lord for the institution of the Blessed Sacrament, and once for the intentions of the Sovereign Pontiff, may gain, under the usual conditions, a partial or plenary indulgence.

The faithful, who on Good Friday strive to meditate for three continuous hours, publicly or privately, on the sufferings of the dying Saviour and the sacred Words which He said on the Cross, or who recite Psalms, hymns or other vocal prayers may gain a plenary indulgence on condition of Confession, Communion on Maundy Thursday or during Easter Week and prayers for the intentions of the Sovereign Pontiff.
