FROM THE RECTOR

The Lessons for the Sixth Sunday after Pentecost encourage our reflection on the sacraments of baptism and Holy Eucharist. The sacramental life of the Church, especially these two great sacraments, provides us the means by which we not only received sanctifying grace from God but also through that grace we are able to render worthy praise and adoration to Him. As Paul reminds the Romans, baptism is the means by which we are able to fully share in the Paschal Mystery of our Savior. To die with Christ in baptism is also to live with Him and the restored, reborn life He gained for us on the cross. Of course, baptism and confirmation are the proper preparation for the reception of the Most Holy Eucharist. The Lord gives us Himself in the Eucharist so that we will have constant contact with the powerful effects of the cross. We should never take for granted the gifts given to us in our Catholic faith through the sacraments; so too, we should guard against underestimating the power of God’s grace given through baptism and the Eucharist. Our hope for the world, our Church and ourselves is founded on manifestation of God’s love for us present in the sacraments. Let us strive to live this week alive in Christ Jesus our Lord!
