FROM THE RECTOR

It is hard to comprehend the depth of Christ's compassion, love and mercy. In our Gospel for the Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost, the Lord restores the deceased son of the widow of Nain to his grieving mother. He brings one who was dead back to life out of compassion for the mother who was bereft and lost without her son. As the Lord restores the young man of Nain, so He restores each of us after we have died in our sins bringing us back to life and returning us to our Mother the Church. His love for us should stir up in us a constant trust and a fervent hope in His power over sin and death and the darkness of the world.

The confusion in the world and in the very heart of Holy Mother the Church requires from all of us constancy and trust in the One who has made manifest that He is trustworthy. There are so many voices causing confusion, sowing doubt and fomenting dissension from the perennial truths of the faith. In order for us to combat the heresies circulating in society and in the Church, we must pray steadfastly and we must educate ourselves. To that end I want to encourage the community to take advantage of the adult faith formation classes being offered by Mr. Chris Baer on Ecclesiology and the Sacraments. Chris Baer is a well-trained catechist and has chosen a timely topic for discussion as he will assist us in understanding the nature of the Church and how She manifests Herself through the sacraments. I also want to encourage everyone to take home and read the Declaration of the Truths Relating to Some of the Most Common Errors in the Life of the Church of Our Time. This pamphlet written by Cardinal Burke, Bishop Athanasius Schneider and three other prelates of the Church provides clear teaching on human sexuality, God's law and the sacraments. These pamphlets are free on Oratory table in the vestibule of the Church.
