FROM THE RECTOR

SECURITY BREACH IN THE RECTORY

This past Sunday, 11/17/19, we experienced a security breach. We believe someone entered through the unlocked door of the St. Francis Chapel and made their way to the Rectory during the 10 am Mass. They pilfered through the offices of Msgr. Morris and Fr. Blake. In the process they found the 8 am collection and stole it. The police were called and took the necessary steps to try to identify the thief.

We are deeply troubled by this incident and are currently working on security measures to ensure this does not happen again. Unfortunately, the thief took the collection bag which contained all of the cash and checks that were collected at the 8am Mass (on 11/17/19). For those of you who contributed, we have no idea to know who you are. Please contact Donna at the office and let her know if you contributed to the collection with cash or check so we can try to get a better idea of what was stolen. We also strongly encourage those of you who wrote a check to stop payment immediately on the check you wrote and closely monitor your bank account for both attempted withdrawals and deposits. If you incur any costs with your bank to stop payment on the check, please let us know so that the Oratory can assist with that cost.

Every effort is being made to quickly implement security protocols that will keep this from every happening again. Some of these security measures are already in place and more will be implemented in the coming days and weeks. In advance, thank you for both your patience and understanding.

As your rector, I deeply regret this situation ever happened. We are deeply grateful for your generosity and work very hard to be good stewards of the blessings bestowed upon the Oratory. Finally, let us pray for the person or persons who stole from us: for forgiveness and for their conversion and transformation of heart.

THE RORATE CAELI MASS:

When: 14 December 2019 @ 6:30 am

The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn.

The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8:

"Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem."

"Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Saviour."

The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in Mary's honor, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ.

The readings and prayers of the Mass foretell the prophecy of the Virgin who would bear a Son called Emmanuel, and call on all to raise the gates of their hearts and their societies to let Christ the King enter; asking for the grace to receive eternal life by the merits of the Incarnation and saving Resurrection of Our Lord.

CONFESSIONS - 14 DECEMBER 2018 from 8:00 am until 11:00 am.

The faithful of both the Oratory and St. Luke will have the opportunity for an extended period of confessions on Saturday morning, 14 December 2018 from 9 am until 11 am. Both Msgr. Morris and Fr. Blake will be available for confession during that time. If you have had difficulty getting to confession,

this may serve as the perfect opportunity to take advantage of the tribunal of mercy especially in preparation for Christmas.
