FROM THE RECTOR – Third Sunday of Lent

Christ conquers Satan! That declarative statement should be the only motivation needed to continue our fidelity to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We have undertaken our Lenten disciplines in order to make ourselves empty that Christ might fill us up. We are aware of our sinfulness, maybe all too well and feel powerless to overcome our faults and failings. This is what Satan wants us to believe, that we are not strong enough to overcome sin and put on the new man who is Christ. Our Gospel from Saint Luke detailing the Lord’s victory over Satan reminds us what the truth actually is: Christ is always the Victor over sin and death. This must translate into a firm conviction that I too can share in this victory if I am remain faithful and stay with the Lord. That I am sinner is true; that Christ is the conqueror of sin is also true. Prepare yourself for sharing in His victory by joyfully making sacrifice. Remain with the Lord by dying to sin and allowing Christ to give you new life!

SEASON OF LENT

During Lent, in addition to the times already published, confessions will be heard before the 7 am Masses on Tuesday and Thursday, beginning at 6 am. **These confession times will begin on Thursday, 12 March 2020.**

Stations of Cross will be celebrated each Friday of Lent at 7 pm. On the two First Fridays of Lent (6 March and 3 April) Stations will begin after the conclusion of Holy Mass.

Finally, the schedule for Holy Week has been determined and again will have the opportunity to celebrate each day of the Sacred Triduum. This information is shared early so that you might plan your schedules accordingly: **HOLY THURSDAY @ 5:00 PM; GOOD FRIDAY @ 3PM; HOLY SATURDAY @ 4:30 PM.**

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.” (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

- Ash Wednesday (February 26, 2020) and Good Friday (April 10, 2020) are days of abstinence for all Catholics over the age of 14. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.
- All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance. Following are several resources that can aid in finding different forms of prayer and penance.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE

Calling all Pro-Life Advocates! **40 Days for Life** will be holding our Spring Campaign starting Ash Wednesday February 26, 2020 and ending on Palm Sunday April 5, 2020. Join us for 40 days of Peaceful Prayer, Hourly Vigil, Fasting, and Fellowship at the Planned Parenthood abortion facility at 317 Salem Place in Fairview Heights. We staff at least 2 people every hour for 12 hours a day for 40 days. Our hours will be 7am- 7pm.

Pray with us in peaceful public witness. Let mothers know you care about them. Your church or organization can “Adopt A Day” and staff multiple hours or you can come on your own. Will you consider

organizing “Adopt A Day” in your parish or assisting your Pro-Life Coordinator? Think about bringing your lay organization for an hour of prayer. OFFICE OF TENEBRAE

“Tenebrae” is the name given to the service of Matins and Lauds belonging to the last three days of Holy Week and normatively anticipated the evening before. These services are marked by a somber and sober, nearly mournful praying of the Divine Office. The structure of the office is sparse reflecting the seriousness of these sacred days and the sadness that should accompany all of us because Christ our Savior suffered for our sins.
