FROM THE RECTOR – Fifth Sunday after Easter

I want to take this opportunity to rejoice in our return to the celebration of public Masses. On Monday, 18 May 2020 at 12:15 pm the Oratory will celebrate Holy Mass. I encourage everyone to be present if their schedule allows them to do so. You will have already received information regarding the conditions under which we are able to be present for Holy Mass. Please carefully observe good hygiene and common sense when interacting with each other. So too, beginning Sunday, 24 May 2020 the Oratory will have a third Holy Mass available to the faithful celebrated at 6:45 am. Below is information regarding our new Mass and Confession schedule.

Let us continue to rejoice in the new life we have received in Christ. Our Savior has conquered sin and death and is the source of our hope. As we anticipate a return to the public celebration of the sacraments we must not only thank God for seeing us safely through the current difficulties but also to entreat the Lord for courage and strength moving forward. I encourage all of us to be mindful that regardless of the world around us we are steadfast and strong in the Lord. These cannot be mere words piously spoken as sound bites for a few faithful listeners; rather our confidence in the Lord, in His grace and power must be the foundation upon which we build our own lives, the lives of families and indeed the whole world. In the Gospel today from Saint John, the Lord entreats us to ask Our Heavenly Father anything in His Name. The Holy Name of Jesus has power and we should call upon Him at all times. As we move forward into a future that is unknown to us, let us find our courage and strength in the knowledge and power of the Lord.

ADDITIONAL HOLY MASS:

In order to provide everyone an opportunity to be present at Holy Mass on Sunday I will be adding an additional Holy Mass at 6:45 am. This will begin on Sunday, 24 May 2020. The 8:00 am and the 11:30 will continue as normal. At the 6:45 am and 8:00 am Low Masses there will no homily given. The 11:30 am High Mass a brief homily will be given. At this juncture, I am asking the faithful to consider being present for the 6:45 am Low Mass so that we will be able to keep social distancing and all be present for Holy Mass. Also, at this time there will be no sign-up sheet for Mass. However, if we arrive at the situation where there are more people at 8:00 am or 11:30 am it could necessitate people signing-up prior to Sunday Mass and, once a Mass time is filled with the allotted number of parishioners, you would have the opportunity for a second or third choice. Again, at this time I am relying upon the faithful to spread themselves out over the three (3) Holy Masses available.

ONGOING CHURCH CLEANING

The new world of COVID-19 requires us to do all that we can to keep ourselves and our faith community healthy as we strive to be holy. To that end we have enlisted the assistance of Woodward to do a deep cleaning of the Church as well as to disinfect the Church every two weeks. The application of this product, every two weeks, will assist us in remaining safe and at the same time minimizing the amount of cleaning that we must do.

Of course, this will cost us. The price for the initial deep cleaning/disinfectant is \$6000.00 and has already taken place. The on-going treatments every two weeks is \$1000.00 a month. In addition to your weekly generosity in support of the Oratory, if you are able to assist with cost of keeping the Church clean that would be greatly appreciated. It is anticipated that we will continue to apply this treatment through the remainder of this calendar year requiring an additional \$8000.00. In advance, thanks for your assistance and your generosity.

So too, we are encouraged to wipe down the pews, doors and public areas after each Mass. The sealant/disinfectant that is being applied to all surfaces in church by Woodward stays active on all surfaces for two weeks; they recommend using a dry cloth to wipe down all surfaces after each Mass.
