FROM THE RECTOR – Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

I often speak about our place as Catholics in the world in which we live and often times do so in a way that reminds us of the conflicts we will inevitably enter into with the world precisely because of what we believe and how we choose to be governed. There are so many causes of the current turmoil both within the Church and the world. However, as believers in truth and children of Holy Mother the Church we are acutely aware of the destructive power of sin and the need to strengthen ourselves against temptation in order overcome sin. Of course, we are able to cooperate with the grace of God because of what happened to us at our baptisms and what continues to happen to us when we participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and receive our Eucharistic Lord. UPCOMING PROJECTS

As the Oratory continues to grow, so do the needs of our community and the prayerful space we call our home. At present, work is being done on the breezeway between the Rectory and the Sacristy. Work is also being done on the 3rd floor of the school to provide more learning space and to make the general ambience more hospitable. Another project, at its beginning stages, is work on the kneelers of the Church. Many of the kneelers are currently cracked; we are awaiting a bid from the upholsterer as to the cost of replacing all the kneelers in the Church. This information is shared in order to keep everyone informed as to the happenings at the Oratory and also to alert you to the possibility of financial assistance for this particular project. In advance, your generosity is always much appreciated.

A SECOND BATHROOM

There has been discussion about the possibility of a second bathroom in the back of the Church. Unfortunately, at this time it is not possible. The general contractor explained that the current space would not allow a new bathroom that would also comply with the ADA.

LIGHT FIXTURE IN CHURCH

Most of you have noticed, by now, that the light near the high pulpit is out. We are not ignoring the issue and are trying to get it repaired. Unfortunately, it is not a simple fix of replacing the bulbs. The fixture is not getting any power to it which means the electricians will need to bring in a lift since they cannot solve the mystery with our scaffolding, which was not tall enough. We have received the bids and are in the process of scheduling the repair. In advance, thank you for your patience as we work to fix the problem.

ADDITIONAL HOLY MASS:

In order to provide everyone an opportunity to be present at Holy Mass on Sunday there will be an additional Holy Mass at 6:45 am. The 8:00 am and the 11:30 will continue as normal. At the 6:45 am and 8:00 am Low Masses there will be no homily given. At the 11:30 am High Mass a brief homily will be given. At this juncture, I am asking the faithful to consider being present for the 6:45 am Low Mass so that we will be able to keep social distancing, and all be present for Holy Mass. Also, at this time there will be no sign-up sheet for Mass. However, if we arrive at the situation where there are more people at 8:00 am or 11:30 am it could necessitate people signingup prior to Sunday Mass and once a Mass time is filled with the allotted number of parishioners you would have the opportunity for a second or third choice. Again, at this time I am relying upon the faithful to spread themselves out over the three (3) Holy Masses available.


