

FROM THE RECTOR – Ninth Sunday after Pentecost

In a certain sense, the Ninth Sunday after Pentecost continues to offer us an opportunity to reflect on Eternal Life. However, in this particular instance the focus is on damnation and separation from God because of our sins, our failure to repent, put aside sin and walking justly in the sight of the Lord. We all want to believe that if we knew the hour when God would call us unto our lives, we would live accordingly during the time immediately preceding our passing from this life to the next. And yet, continue to fall into sin makes clear that we are not firm in our resolve. The Lord enjoins us to live each day in preparation for Eternal Life. Therefore, knowledge of the particular day of our death is inconsequential. At some point, I will leave this world. Where I go from here depends upon my cooperation with the grace of God and reliance upon His Divine Mercy. The Church has sadly moved away from preaching about Hell and even about Purgatory lest She be perceived as insensitive to the "gospel of nice" that has developed in recent years. Nevertheless, Hell exists and sin places us there and we need to strive mightily in this life to receive the place prepared for us in the next. If we believe in the power of God's grace and accept the efficacy of the sacraments of Holy Mother Church and rely upon the Lord's mercy then we are well armed to fight sin in our lives and to share in the glory of God!

CELEBRATION OF ST. LOUIS, KING OF FRANCE

The Feast of St. Louis, King of France is celebrated on 25 August which is a Tuesday this year. Given that he is the patron of the Archdiocese along with the desire on the part of some members of the community to discredit and dishonor him, this year we will give even more attention to our celebration of this great saint of Holy Mother Church.

On Monday, 24 August 2020 beginning at 4:30 pm we will have Eucharistic Adoration; at 5:15 pm we will celebrate Sung Vespers; at 6:00 pm we will conclude with Benediction. This schedule allows those who want to make their way to the Statue of St. Louis in Forest Park for the Rosary at 6:30 pm.

On Tuesday, 25 August 2020, we will have our normal 7:00 am Holy Mass; in addition, we will celebrate High Mass at 12:15; the day will conclude with Adoration at 4 pm until 5 pm Benediction and then a procession from the Oratory to the Statue of St. Louis in Forest Park (approx. 1.9 mi.) for the rosary at 6:30 pm.

I would strongly encourage everyone to make an effort to be a part of all or some of these liturgical opportunities.
