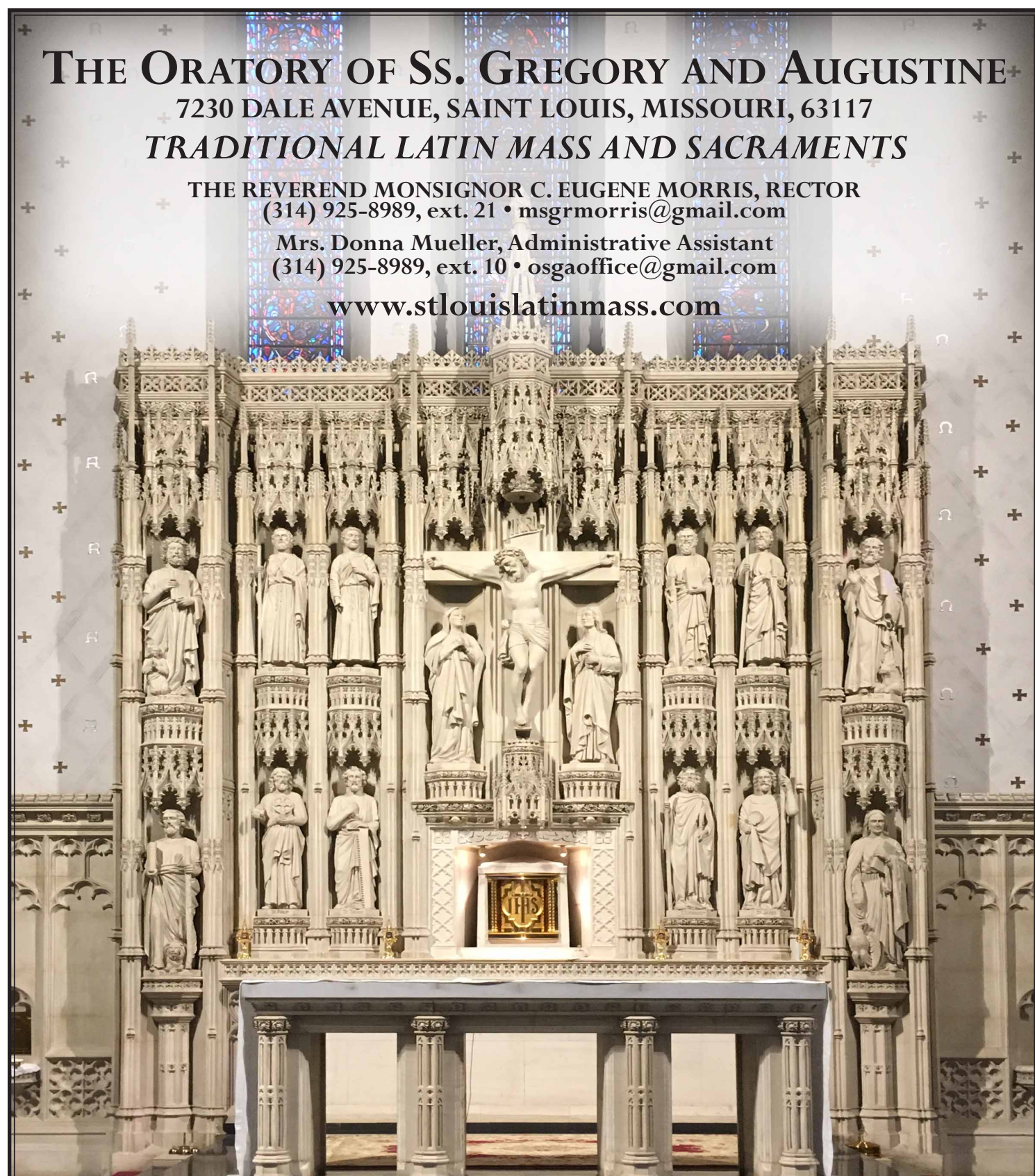

FROM THE RECTOR – Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost

When St. John Paul II promulgated ***Dominus Jesus*** on the universality of the mystery of Jesus Christ there was some resistance to the force with which the document reiterates the centrality and necessity of Christ for the world. While this resistance made sense from non-Christians, the fact that certain Christian ecclesial communities and some in the Church Herself resisted this declaration manifested their lack of understanding of who Christ is and what He has accomplished for us. The incarnation, the Word Made Flesh, allows us to have a relationship with the Father and the Spirit. We must become unto Christ in all that we are and allow Him to make His dwelling with in us. St. Paul exhorts the Ephesians to allow Christ to dwell in their hearts and to come to knowledge of the His great charity. Apart from Christ we are nothing, but with Him we are able to become saints. This is not hyperbole, but the truth of our faith. This life unto Christ makes it possible for us to be instruments of grace for the world, to live peaceably with, and to foster unity among men. Having the opportunity for weekly Eucharistic Adoration provides us with the experience needed to deepen our relationship with the Lord. We must use all the graces God bestows upon us. As St. Paul concludes today: ***to Him be glory in the Church, and in Christ Jesus, unto all generations, world without end. Amen!***
