

## FROM THE RECTOR – ALL SAINTS

Today we are blessed to celebrate All the Saints in glory. The celebration of this feast commemorates the dedication of the Church of Our Lady and the Martyrs which is now known as the Church of All Saints. The church dedicated had been the site of a pagan temple to all the known gods at that time. As a consequence, this feast truly celebrates the power of Christ shining through His holy men and women to conquer the forces of paganism and idolatry. The lives of the Saints are a constant reminder of the redemptive work of grace and our ability to cooperate with grace to live rightly in the sight of God. Our Gospel recounts to the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount and the Beatitudes which are the road map for holiness. Those virtues rejected by the world become the means by which men can do all the things God has commanded them to do. If we are obedient to that which Christ sets before us we are able to receive the crown of glory worn by the holy women and men who have gone before us.

## ALL SOULS

For All Souls Day, Monday, 20 November 2020, priests are given the privilege of celebrating three Masses. We will celebrate the normal 12:15 pm Holy Mass along with Holy Mass at 7 am (Low Mass) and 7 pm (High Mass). As our Catholic duty we should constantly be praying for all the souls in purgatory especially our own loved ones. This is a grace-filled opportunity to apply the merits of the greatest prayer of the Church to all the faithful departed.

## NOVEMBER & THE HOLY SOULS

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. There are several plenary indulgences available for the first week in November [this year, any 8 days throughout the month], beginning on November 1st, All Saints Day. They are as follows:

### # 29 For the faithful departed

(Reference: [Enchiridion Indulgentiarum](#), 4th edition)

§ 1. A plenary indulgence, applied exclusively to the souls in Purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who:

1° on each single day, from the first to the eighth day in November, devoutly visit a cemetery and, even if only mentally, pray for the faithful departed; [Note: one plenary indulgence for each day, if the usual conditions are met]

2° on the day of Commemoration of All Faithful Departed [November 2] (or, according to the Ordinary, on the preceding or subsequent Sunday, or on the day of the solemnity of All Saints) piously visit a church or oratory and there recite the Pater and the Credo.

**PLEASE NOTE:** This year, however, the Major Penitentiary has decreed an important change, due to the ongoing pandemic: instead of being limited to November 1st-8th, the faithful can transfer the possibility of achieving indulgences for the faithful departed to any particular day during the whole month of November, for the same total of eight days, but not necessarily contiguous days.

When you call to request a particular day, remember that Mass normally celebrated only on First Saturday and one of the Sunday Masses must be celebrated for the faithful of the Oratory. So too, if and/or when requests come for Gregorian Masses you will be contacted if that impacts the date you requested for Holy Mass. Holy Masses are now being scheduled for January 2021. 
