FROM THE RECTOR – Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost

St. Paul’s exhortation to the Philippians reminds them of the necessity of dying to their passions in order to live with God for all eternity. Having celebrated the lives of the Saints and continuing to pray for our beloved dead, we are mindful that are cooperation with grace here on earth makes possible our place in heaven. To strive for sanctity on a daily basis necessitates subjecting our existence to the work of Christ for it is only in Him and through His grace that we are able to successfully carry the crosses given to us. The majority of the world is truly the enemy of Christ and His Cross. If we are to defeat our enemy, the victory lies in accepting the very realities that the enemy rejects: the cross, sacrifice, and the life of Christian charity. Given the state of the world it would seem that the enemy has achieved the upper hand. But we know that this is a lie. Christ’s victory is proclaimed as a given fact not a future to be achieved. What remains to be seen is how we will share in that victory. If we continue to live from the flesh satisfying our earthly needs and wants, then we too will be enemies of Christ. Or we can give ourselves over to the Lord who will transform our lowliness and allow us to share in His glorified life. So, the task at hand is the on-going contemplation of heaven and speaking only of the things of God living a life of sacrifice and service that give glory to the Triune God!

NOVEMBER & THE HOLY SOULS

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. There are several plenary indulgences available for the first week in November [this year, any 8 days throughout the month], beginning on November 1st, All Saints Day. They are the following:

- # 29 For the faithful departed
(Reference: [Enchiridion Indulgentiarum](#), 4th edition)
- § 1. A plenary indulgence, applied exclusively to the souls in Purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who:
- 1° on each single day, from the first to the eighth day in November, devoutly visit a cemetery and, even if only mentally, pray for the faithful departed; [Note: one plenary indulgence for each day, if the usual conditions are met]

2° on the day of Commemoration of All Faithful Departed [November 2] (or, according to the Ordinary, on the preceding or subsequent Sunday, or on the day of the solemnity of All Saints) piously visit a church or oratory and there recite the Pater and the Credo.

PLEASE NOTE: This year the Major Penitentiary has [decreed](#) an important change, due to the ongoing pandemic: instead of being limited to November 1st-8th, the faithful can transfer the possibility of achieving indulgences for the faithful departed to any particular day during the whole month of November, for the same total of eight days, but not necessarily contiguous days.

THE BOOK OF THE DEAD

The Book of the Dead is located near the St. Joseph Altar; please inscribe the names of your deceased loved ones so that they might be prayed for during the month of November.

YEARLY RETREAT

Since the pandemic closed many retreat houses, the possibility for yearly retreat during the summer did not exist. I will be away on retreat from Sunday evening, 8 November until Friday, 13 November. During that week there will be **NO** public Masses, Confessions or Eucharistic Adoration. Those who have requested Mass intentions for those days, they will be honored at the Masses I celebrate while I am on retreat. In advance I appreciate your flexibility with the schedule and I ask that you pray for me.

THANKSGIVING DAY

The Oratory will celebrate its normal 7:00 am Holy Mass on Thanksgiving Day (Thursday, 28 November 2019). Please come for Holy Mass and offer the most fitting act of thanksgiving, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Ladies, mark your calendars for the Oratory’s Advent by Candlelight on **December 19 at 6:30 PM**.
