FROM THE RECTOR – Resumed 6th Sunday after Epiphany

The Kingdom of Heaven is the goal of our existence. We are created to long for the Lord and that longing is not fulfilled until we reach the heavenly kingdom. The Lord provides us with abundance graces to satisfy the thirst that is in us for the His Heavenly Kingdom. The Lord speaks in Saint Matthew’s Gospel of various ways to describe the Kingdom of Heaven: a grain of mustard seed that when fully grown supports all the birds who come and nest there even though it began small and unassuming; the kingdom is leaven that full rises and satisfy all who feed upon it. He reveals these things to us in parables to keep our minds and hearts attuned to Him and the power of His words. So too, St. Paul reminds the Thessalonians of the power of the word to transform society and culture through not only that which is spoken but also the manner in which we live lives of charity and obedience to Him alone. Now more than ever we will need to work to build the kingdom here as we long for its fulfillment in Christ. Through small and unassuming acts of charity, striving for authentic harmony and peace in God in Christ, we make manifest the living God in our daily lives. Consequently, let us hold fast and sure to that which God has promised – a kingdom of peace, mercy, and love abounding for those who listen to the Master’s voice and follow Him. We are not complete until we see God face to face. Let us strive now in this life for true joy that is found only in the Lord!

NOVEMBER & THE HOLY SOULS

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. There are several plenary indulgences available for the first week in November [this year, any 8 days throughout the month], beginning on November 1st, All Saints Day. They are the following:

- # 29 For the faithful departed
- (Reference: [Enchiridion Indulgentiarum](#), 4th edition)
- § 1. A plenary indulgence, applied exclusively to the souls in Purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who:
- 1° on each single day, from the first to the eighth day in November, devoutly visit a cemetery and, even if only mentally, pray for the faithful departed; [Note: one plenary indulgence for each day, if the usual conditions are met]

2° on the day of Commemoration of All Faithful Departed [November 2] (or, according to the Ordinary, on the preceding or subsequent Sunday, or on the day of the solemnity of All Saints) piously visit a church or oratory and there recite the Pater and the Credo.

PLEASE NOTE: This year the Major Penitentiary has [decreed](#) an important change, due to the ongoing pandemic: instead of being limited to November 1st-8th, the faithful can transfer the possibility of achieving indulgences for the faithful departed to any particular day during the whole month of November, for the same total of eight days, but not necessarily contiguous days.

THE BOOK OF THE DEAD

The Book of the Dead is located near the St. Joseph Altar; please inscribe the names of your deceased loved ones so that they might be prayed for during the month of November.

THANKSGIVING DAY

The Oratory will celebrate its normal 7:00 am Holy Mass on Thanksgiving Day (Thursday, 28 November 2019). Please come for Holy Mass and offer the most fitting act of thanksgiving, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

ADVENT BY CANDLELIGHT

Ladies, mark your calendars for the Oratory’s Advent by Candlelight on **December 19 at 6:30 PM**. Gather together with women of the Oratory and friends of our community for an evening of prayer, reflection and fellowship. Msgr. Morris will be our speaker for the evening.
