Holy Name of Jesus

January 3, 2021

FROM THE RECTOR – Holy Name of Jesus

The celebration of the Holy Name of Jesus provides us with the opportunity to celebrate the power of the Name of the Lord. Not only does God become man dwelling among His people to bring about salvation, healing and peace but also He allows us to be brought into intimate relationship with Him, calling Him by name and enjoying a familiarity with God that only He could allow. In other relationships this familiarity could lead to a devaluing of the relationship creating a false sense of equality among those in the relationship; however, to speak, to know the Name of Jesus is to all the more know of God's grandeur and power, His might and majesty precisely because He deigns to let us call Him by Name. Of course, as with all aspects of the Incarnation, we are well prepared through the Name of Jesus to then call God our Father. This cannot happen unless we know Christ and call upon His name for our salvation and peace. We continue to contemplate the mystery of the Incarnation, let us rejoice and marvel at what God has done for us by remaining with and allowing us to call Him by Name.

VIGIL OF EPIPHANY – BLESSING OF WATER AND SALT

The Vigil of the Epiphany of Our Lord is Tuesday, 5 January 2021. In addition to our normally schedule Holy Mass at 7 am the Oratory will also celebrate Holy Mass at 7:00 pm. At the conclusion of Holy Mass, we will celebrate the tradition blessing of water and salt. You are welcome to bring water and salt to be blessed that day. There will also be gallons of water to take home in your own containers. If you choose to bring your own water to be blessed, please make sure that the container is open and large enough so that salt can be poured into it. The water and salt should be brought to Church the evening of the Vigil and can be placed near the altar of Saint Joseph.

LITURGICAL VARIA

You will have notice during our time here at Saint Luke the Evangelist, the Oratory has been exposed to more and more elements from the treasure of the Church's tradition: we have employed the second Confiteor at Holy Mass; the use of the Sanctus candle at Low Mass placed on the altar at the beginning of the Canon; this Advent season there has been the use of the Benedicamus Domino at the conclusion of Holy Mass which is used at Holy Masses where there is no Gloria prescribed.

In addition to these elements, going forward at Sunday Masses and major feasts days there will be several Collects. The reason for this is that the Church desires that saints' days and major feasts always be celebrated either through being the primary celebration of the day or by being commemorated through the recitation of multiple Collects. So too, the Church encourages us to pray to the Blessed Virgin Mary and to offer prayers for the Defense of the Church. As a consequence, on any given Sunday there will be at least 3 Collects prayed at Holy Mass: the Collect for that particular day; the 2nd Collect for our Blessed Mother; the 3rd Collect for the Defense of the Church. There will be occasions when this changes and that would happen based on multiple saints' days needing to be celebrated. The seasonal Collects for Our Lady and the Collect for the Defense of the Church will appear in the bulletin and in the back of the Church in the coming weeks. All effort will be made to keep the community informed and your patience and forbearance are greatly appreciated.

OCTAVE CELEBRATIONS

The Oratory is blessed this year to celebrate both the Octave of Christmas and the Octave of Epiphany. In the history of the Church there have been as many as 16-18 Octaves celebrated throughout the liturgical year some of which would overlap each other. One manner of celebrating the various octaves of the Church is to commemorate only the 8th day of the minor octaves celebrated. The Oratory will begin this custom during the Christmas season. There are several Octaves that begin during the Christmas season: the Octave of St. Stephen, St. John the Evangelist, and the Holy Innocents. The Oratory will honor these Octaves by commemorating the saint/feast on the 8th day or last day of the Octave.

FACE MASKS

The Oratory has recently been informed that a parishioner from St. Luke has reported us to the Archdiocese for not wearing facemasks into and on the way out of the Church. This is diocesan regulation: facemasks must be worn coming into Church and departing. Once you have arrived at the pew you are free to do as you wish with the mask. I remind everyone again of their need to comply with this regulation. It has been communicated that if we do not comply, we run the risk of being shut down. I understand the conflicting issues regarding individual freedoms and governmental interference in sacred worship. Nevertheless, I am asking for the sake of the good work that is being accomplished, the growth that we continue to experience and the manifold graces of the traditional Holy Mass that everyone make a concerted effort to weak their masks accordingly. 
