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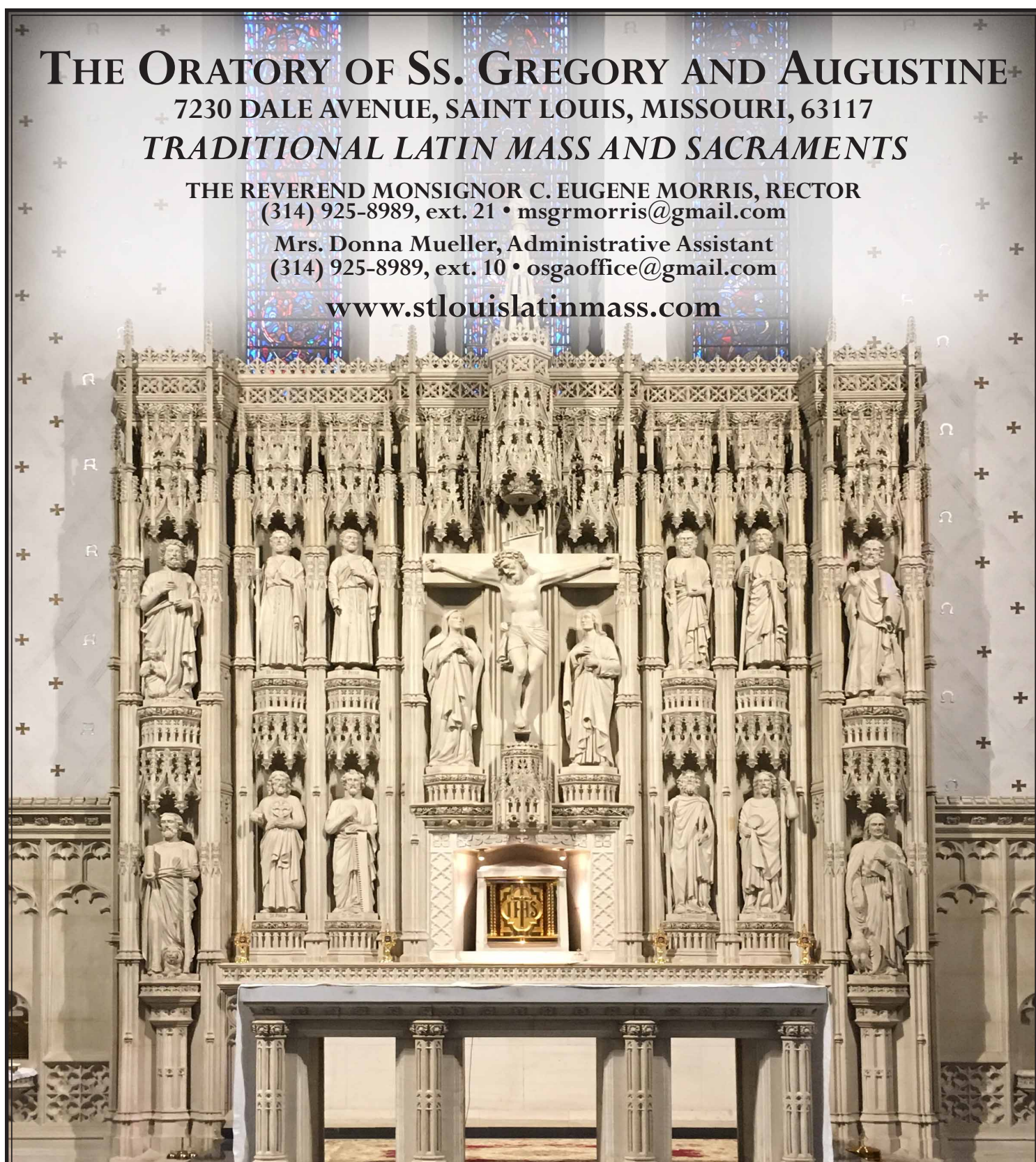

FROM THE RECTOR – Third Sunday after Epiphany

Saint Paul’s exhortation to the Romans provide not only excellent spiritual advice but also good, solid wisdom for how men are to live well with each other. There is ample evidence of the divisions that separate men from another: religious intolerance and the persecution of Holy Mother the Church; identity politics and the cancel culture which simply writes its opponent out of history. We remain separated by class, by race, and by age. These divisions, however, need not become chasms too large to bridge. The answer to the authentic unity of the human race rests in the primary union into which we have been created and in which we have reborn: The Most Holy Trinity and Our Savior Jesus Christ! Through our creation in the image and likeness of the Triune God, we are obligated to practice the charity and patience to which Saint Paul calls the Romans. We must strive for peace and charity most especially with our enemies. So too our union with those with whom we disagree, fight or struggle cannot be based solely on the desire for an absence of violence but make itself manifest in our service to others. A practice of the Corporal Works of Mercy is animated by our love of God and the things of Holy Mother Church. It is only through a deliberate living of the Christian life that any sure hope can be found for the changes that need to take place in the current climate. Christ has the power to heal and to restore; He desires to use that power for our own salvation; for all that He expects and for all that He Gives, let us give thanks.

SEASON OF SEPTUAGESIMA AND LENT

The season of Septuagesima begins next Sunday, 31 January 2021 and provides us with the opportunity to better prepare ourselves for our Lenten Season which begins on Wednesday, 17 February 2021. In order to spiritually assist the faithful of the Oratory during the Lenten season there will be additional opportunities for confession.

During Lent, in addition to the times already published, confessions will be heard before the 7 am Masses on Tuesday and Thursday, beginning at 6 am. **These confession times will begin on Thursday, 18 February 2021.**

We will also have the morning of Confessions on Saturday, 14 March 2020 from 8:00 am until 11:00 am.

Stations of Cross will be celebrated each Friday of Lent at immediately following the 12:15 pm Holy Mass.

Finally, the schedule for Holy Week has been determined and again will have the opportunity to celebrate each day of the Sacred Triduum. This information is shared early so that you might plan your schedules accordingly: **HOLY THURSDAY @ 4:00 PM; GOOD FRIDAY @ 3PM; HOLY SATURDAY @ 4:00 PM.**

All of this information will continue to be available both in the bulletin and on-line. Also, next Sunday there will be a sheet on the Oratory table in the vestibule that will have all this information for our Lenten season.

BLESSING OF CANDLES/FEAST OF THE PURIFICATION OF THE BVM

The Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated this year on Tuesday, 2 February 2021. In addition to our normal 7:00 am Holy Mass we will also celebrate an evening Mass at 7:00 pm which we include the blessing of candles. Those who desire to have candles blessed must bring them to Church by Sunday, 31 January. The candles will then be moved into the sanctuary for blessing. Please be mindful that because of the sanctuary space there are limitations to the number of candles that can be blessed. Please use your best judgment when bringing candles for blessing. The blessed candles must be clearly marked with your name and may be retrieved at the conclusion of Holy Mass.

More Information: The candle blessing -- one of the three principle blessings of the liturgical year, the others being the blessing of [palms](#) and [ashes](#) -- will be given by the priest wearing a purple cope. He will pray 5 prayers over the candles placed near the Altar. The candles are sprinkled three times while the Aspérge me is sung, and then they are incensed and distributed. When we take a blessed candle from the priest's hand, we kiss the candle and then the priest's hand, just as we do on Palm Sunday when we kiss the palm and then the priest's hand when receiving the blessed palms.

There follows a [procession](#) with the lighted candles. Then the Mass begins, and the lighted candles are held during the reading of the Gospel and from the beginning of the Canon of the Mass to Communion.

It is customary to bring candles from home to be blessed -- at least 51% beeswax candles that one uses for devotional purposes (candles for the family altar, Advent candles, etc.) -- so they can be lit after dusk on [All Saints' Day](#) (1 November), during the [Sacrament of Unction](#), and during storms and times of trouble.

FACE MASKS

The Oratory has recently been informed that a parishioner from St. Luke has reported us to the Archdiocese for not wearing facemasks into and on the way out of the Church. I remind everyone again of their need to comply with this regulation. It has been communicated that if we do not comply, we run the risk of being shut down. I understand the conflicting issues regarding individual freedoms and governmental interference in sacred worship. Nevertheless, I am asking for the sake of the good work that is being accomplished, the growth that we continue to experience and the manifold graces of the traditional Holy Mass that everyone make a concerted effort to weak their masks accordingly.
