



FROM THE RECTOR – Easter Sunday

St. Paul exhorts the Corinthians: "... and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins" (1 Corinthians 15:17). All of our sacrifices during this Lenten season have brought us to the Cross and through the Cross we have received new life. The new dispensation made manifest in Christ and now complete in the fully revealed Paschal Mystery, makes clear that covenant with the Triune God involves not only goodness in this life, but the guarantee of goodness in the life to come.
