## FROM THE RECTOR - Tenth Sunday after Pentecost

The virtue of humility is difficult to cultivate in any age, but particularly difficult for modern man because he is convinced of his own power and ability. The modern age, about which I speak often, is beset with a whole host of problems and they all may be traced to the arrogance and hubris of the age. The men who built the Tower of Babel believed that they would be able to reach God instead of relying upon God to reach down to us. In this present age our arrogance has taken a different manifestation: refusing to acknowledge God at all. The more technology grants us success, the greater our hubris and pride. For most of modernity, even if God is alive, He makes no difference or impact in their lives. Of course, we believe and know something different and in truth so do most men. The law of God, the love of God is written in our hearts and when we are honest, we know that apart from God we can do nothing. We must conquer all our prideful impulses and submit with joy to the will of God. In our humility we will be better instruments of God's grace for our own salvation and the salvation of the whole world.

The veneration of relics and their placement either in the mensa (table) of the altar or near an altar is an ancient and venerable tradition attested to from the very early writings of the Church Fathers. The Council of Trent addresses the importance of relics: "*The holy Synod* enjoins on all bishops, and others who sustain the office and charge of teaching, that, agreeably to the usage of the Catholic and Apostolic Church, received from the primitive times of the Christian religion, and agreeably to the consent of the holy Fathers, and to the decrees of sacred Councils, they especially instruct the faithful diligently concerning the intercession and invocation of saints; the honor (paid) to relics; and the legitimate use of images: teaching them, that the saints, who reign together with Christ, offer up their own prayers to God for men; that it is good and useful suppliantly to invoke them, and to have recourse to their prayers, aid, (and) help for obtaining benefits from God, through His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who is our alone Redeemer and Savior." (Session 25).

The Oratory currently is blessed with the relic of 12 saints situated on the ledge underneath the tabernacle. The four closest to the Tabernacle on either side are: St. Augustine of Canterbury & St. Bede the Venerable (Blessed Mother/Gospel side); St. Gregory the Great & St. Benedict (St. Joseph/Epistle Side). These were the four original relics that have been a part of the Oratory liturgical life since its inception. The other relics are:
