FROM THE RECTOR - 19th Sunday after Pentecost

We are all called to strive for holiness in our daily lives: to seek to become Saints! The achievement of this sanctity requires cooperation with God's grace and reveals the need to strive mightily to conform ourselves to His will. Moreover, the road to holiness involves sacrifice and a joyful embrace of the Cross of Our Savior. This willingness to suffer and sacrifice makes itself manifest when we clothe ourselves with virtue. St. Paul in his exhortation to the Ephesians, reminds us to put on the new Man who is Christ, and this involves a life of justice and holiness in truth. Becoming this new creation requires an abhorrence of sin, avoiding any and all things that might lead us to sin, mortal and venial sin alike. Our participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass strengthens us in our resolve to strive for the holiness, and to clothe ourselves in the mantle of virtue so that we might be more Christ-like in our daily lives. Moreover, the month of October is devoted to Our Lady, sinless from the moment of Her own Immaculate Conception, was able to perfectly cooperate with the graces of God and becomes the tabernacle of Truth Himself. As we honor Our Lady, let us have fervent and constant recourse to Her, especially through Her Most Holy Rosary, to follow Her example. Following Her example, avoid sin, embrace virtue, and rejoice in the Cross. Let your desire for sanctity make you worthy dwelling places for the Word Made Flesh!

CHRIST THE KING

The celebration of Christ the King is Sunday, October 31st. We will honor Our Lord and King with a Eucharistic Procession, Adoration and Benediction. At the completion of the 11:30 am Holy Mass we will begin the procession and upon our return to Church have time for Adoration. At the completion of Adoration, we will conclude with Benediction. The afternoon will conclude with First Vespers for the Feast of All Saints at 3:00 pm. If you already come to an earlier Mass, please plan to return after the 11:30 am Mass for the Procession, Adoration, and Vespers. May Christ the King always reign in our hearts.

Those young people recently confirmed and those who made their First Holy Communion are invited to dress in their communion clothes and participate in the procession.

This is a grace-filled opportunity to apply the merits of the greatest prayer of the Church to all the faithful departed.

A native of England, Joseph Pearce is the internationally acclaimed author of many books, which include bestsellers such as *The Quest for Shakespeare, Tolkien: Man and Myth, The Unmasking of Oscar Wilde, C. S. Lewis and The Catholic Church, Literary Converts, Wisdom and Innocence: A Life of G.K. Chesterton, Solzhenitsyn: A Soul in Exile and Old Thunder: A Life of Hilaire Belloc.* His books have been published and translated into Spanish, Portuguese, French, Dutch, Italian, Korean, Mandarin, Croatian and Polish.

He has hosted two 13-part television series about Shakespeare on EWTN, and has also written and presented documentaries on EWTN on the Catholicism of *The Lord of the Rings* and *The Hobbit*. His verse drama, *Death Comes for the War Poets*, was performed off-Broadway to critical acclaim. He has participated and lectured at a wide variety of international and literary events at major colleges and universities in the U.S., Canada, Britain, Europe, Africa and South America. FIRST FRIDAY/FIRST SATURDAY

Friday, 1 October and Saturday 2 October are First Friday and Saturday respectively. In addition to the normal Friday schedule, the schedule for these days includes Holy Mass in the Evening on First Friday beginning at 6 pm with confessions and 7:15 pm with Holy Mass. First Saturday Confessions begin at 7 am with Holy Mass at 8:15 am. **Please note the change in Mass times: this allows for a full hour of confessions on First Friday and First Saturday**. Also, we will have Adoration on First Friday from 9 am until 6 pm.

The celebration of the Divine Office is the framework for the Church's daily life of prayer, which culminates in the offering of Holy Mass. In earlier centuries, this prayer cycle was a part of daily parish life. Its popularity waned in the 20^{th} century, despite the regular urging of popes and the Fathers of Vatican II that pastors return it to parish churches.

The last two years we have celebrated in the Oratory various hours of the Divine Office publicly for the feast of St Louis the King, for Christmas, and for Tenebrae, the Office of the Triduum sung during Holy Week. A good number of people were able to join us for these liturgies. On Sunday, 7 November we will begin regularly celebrating Sunday Vespers @ 4:30 pm, the evening hour of the Office. As we begin this important enhancement of our common prayer life, in November we will offer a series of three presentations in order to provide an orientation to praying the Divine Office.

- 1. Tuesday 9 November: The Divine Office: an introduction.
- 2. Tuesday 16 November: The Divine Office: the calendar.
- 3. Tuesday 23 November: The Divine Office: the structure.

Over these three evenings, we will provide an overview of the history, theology, structure, and spirituality of the Office, and its intimate relationship to Holy Mass. Each presentation will begin at 7:00 pm and end by 8.30pm. We invite everyone to join us and hope as many as possible will be able to attend.
