FROM THE RECTOR - 22nd Sunday after Pentecost

In the Gospel from Saint Matthew, the Lord enjoins us to render to Caesar the things of Caesar and the things of God to God. St. Hilary of Poitiers offers this reflection: "How wonderful this answer, and how perfect the fulfilment of the prescribed Divine Law! So beautifully does He here indicate the middle way between not caring for the things of the world, on the one hand, and the offence of injuring Caesar, on the other, that He proves the perfect freedom of minds, however devoted to God, to discharge all human duties by commanding them to render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's." The Saint goes on to exhort us to remember that we are God's first and as such, if we remain with Him, there is no need to give anything over to Caesar. St. Augustine reflects that we are the coins of God and just as Caesar's coin was returned to him, so we should always be returned to the Father. Both of these great saints make clear that as we live in the world, we should never be of the world. Moreover, our detachment from the things of the world is not born of indifference or resignation but rather comes from the desire to allow God to be that which consumes all of us: body and soul. The task before us is to live only and always for God and never run the risk of divided loyalties or conflicted emotions. Be always God's servant and Christ's disciple and the things of this world will never cause you harm.

CHRIST THE KING

The celebration of Christ the King is Sunday, 31 October and we will honor Our Lord and King with a Eucharistic Procession, Adoration and Benediction. At the completion of the 11:30 am Holy Mass we will begin the procession and upon our return to Church have a time for Adoration. At the completion of Adoration, we will conclude with Benediction. The afternoon will conclude with First Vespers for the Feast of All Saints at 3:00 pm. If you already come to an earlier Mass, please plan to return after the 11:30 am Mass for the Procession, Adoration and Vespers. May Christ the King always reign in our hearts.

Those young people recently confirmed and those who made their First Holy Communion are invited to dress in their communion clothes and participate in the procession.

PRESENTATIONS ON CELEBRATING THE DIVINE OFFICE

The celebration of the Divine Office is the framework for the Church's daily life of prayer, which culminates in the offering of Holy Mass. In earlier centuries, this prayer cycle was a part of daily parish life. Its popularity waned in the $20^{\rm th}$ century, despite the regular urging of popes and the Fathers of Vatican II that pastors return it to parish churches.

The last two years we have celebrated in the Oratory various hours of the Divine Office publicly for the feast of St Louis the King, for Christmas, and for Tenebrae, the Office of the Triduum sung during Holy Week. A good number of people were able to join us for these liturgies. On Sunday, 7 November we will begin regularly celebrating Sunday Vespers at 4:30 pm, the evening hour of the Office. As we begin this important enhancement of our common prayer life, in November we will offer a series of three presentations in order to provide an orientation to praying the Divine Office.

- 1. Tuesday 9 November: The Divine Office: an introduction.
- 2. Tuesday 16 November: The Divine Office: the calendar.
- 3. Tuesday 23 November: The Divine Office: the structure.

Over these three evenings, we will provide an overview of the history, theology, structure, and spirituality of the Office, and its intimate relationship to Holy Mass. Each presentation will begin at 7:00 pm and end by 8:30pm. We invite everyone to join us and hope as many as possible will be able to attend.

Allowing our prayers to rise like incense

The celebration of the Divine Office is the framework for the Church's daily life of prayer, which culminates in the offering of Holy Mass. In earlier centuries, this prayer cycle was a part of daily parish life. Its popularity waned in the 20th century, despite the regular urging of popes and the Fathers of Vatican II that pastors return it to parish churches.

Over the past several years, the Oratory has celebrated various hours of the Divine Office publicly: for the feast of St Louis the King, for Christmas, and for Tenebrae, the Office of the Triduum, sung during Holy Week. In order to prepare for a return to this great and ancient form of prayer to our Oratory life, these series of three presentations will provide an orientation to praying the Divine Office.

These three evenings will provide an overview of the history, theology, structure, and spirituality of the Office, and its intimate relationship to Holy Mass. Each presentation will begin at 7:00pm and end by 8:30pm. We invite everyone to join us and hope as many as possible will be able to attend.

WHO: Mr. Stan Metheny: Stan Metheny earned a Master of Arts degree in Theology in 1976 and in the decades since has pursued further post graduate studies in liturgy and Gregorian chant in various universities and in various monasteries of the Solesmes congregation. His primary focus has been on the manuscripts and chants of the Divine Office. He has been a schola director for over 40 years and has led workshops in the US and the UK devoted to teaching the chants of the Office.

For although all our Scripture, both the Old and New, is divinely inspired and useful for doctrine, as it is written, the Book of Psalms, like a paradise containing in itself (the fruits) all the others, gives forth songs, and with them also shows its own songs in psalmody (cantus edit, et proprios insuper cum ipsis inter psallendum exhibet). Such are the words of Athanasius (Epist. Ad Marcell. Op. cit. no. 2), who rightly adds in the same place: "To me it seems that the psalms for him who sings them are as a mirror in which he may contemplate himself and the movements of his soul and, under this influence, recite them" (op. cit. no. 12).
