### FROM THE RECTOR - Christ the King

*Christus vincit! Christus regnat! Christus imperat*! – Christ conquers, Christ reigns, Christ commands. As we celebrate today the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King, we make these words our own anthem of praise and adoration. In establishing this great feast, Pius XI intended to not only remind the world of the absolute sovereignty of the Lord but also the necessity for the growth and health of society to hold fast to this truth. It has been almost 100 years since the establishment of this feast and if it was necessary then to remind society and culture of the authority of Christ over all men, it is even more necessary in our current age. We see everywhere the devasting effects of governing without recourse to the Lord, of living as if God does not matter, of ejecting the things of God from every aspect of life. Society would have us believe that we no longer have need of God; however, the state of man and the on-going corruption of his soul, clearly indicates that we are in desperate need of God to inhabit and inform every aspect of our existences. And this is where it must begin: to transform society and culture we must always be in a posture of receptivity to the transforming grace of God in our lives. We must strive to allow God to always govern us. In humility we must seek to conform our wills to the Divine Master knowing that apart from Him we can do nothing, but through Him we can share in the victory that Our King has gained for us on the Cross.

#### CHRIST THE KING

Today will celebrate Christ the King is Sunday. At the conclusion of the 11:30 am Holy Mass we will honor Our Lord and King with a Eucharistic Procession, Adoration, and Benediction. At the completion of the 11:30 am Holy Mass we will begin the procession and upon our return to Church have a time for Adoration. Following Adoration, we will have Benediction and then conclude the afternoon with First Vespers for the Feast of All Saints at 3:00 pm.

#### ALL SAINTS DAY

For the celebration of the Solemnity of All Saints (Monday, 1 November) we will celebrate the usual Holy Mass at 12:15 pm with confessions before at 11 am. Also, we will celebrate a Solemn High Mass at 7:15 pm with confessions preceding at 6:00 pm.

#### ALL SOULS DAY

For the Commemoration of All Souls (Tuesday, 2 November) we will celebrate three Masses as priests are given the privilege of doing so on this. Masses will be the normal time of 7:00 am; 12:15 pm and 7:15 pm with confessions at 6:00 pm. All are encouraged to attend and to pray for All the Faithful Departed and to keep the First Saturday devotion given to us by Our Blessed Mother.

The celebration of the Divine Office is the framework for the Church's daily life of prayer, which culminates in the offering of Holy Mass. In earlier centuries, this prayer cycle was a part of daily parish life. Its popularity waned in the  $20^{\rm th}$  century, despite the regular urging of popes and the Fathers of Vatican II that pastors return it to parish churches.

The last two years we have celebrated in the Oratory various hours of the Divine Office publicly for the feast of St Louis the King, for Christmas, and for Tenebrae, the Office of the Triduum sung during Holy Week. A good number of people were able to join us for these liturgies. **On 7 November** we will begin regularly celebrating Sunday Vespers at 4:30 pm, the

**evening hour of the Office**. As we begin this important enhancement of our common prayer life, in November we will offer a series of three presentations in order to provide an orientation to praying the Divine Office.

- 2. Tuesday 16 November: The Divine Office: the calendar.
- 3. Tuesday 23 November: The Divine Office: the structure.

Over these three evenings, we will provide an overview of the history, theology, structure, and spirituality of the Office, and its intimate relationship to Holy Mass. Each presentation will begin at 7:00 pm and end by 8:30pm. We invite everyone to join us and hope as many as possible will be able to attend.

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Besides, there is in the Psalms a certain wonderful power for stimulating zeal in men's minds for all the virtues. For although all our Scripture, both the Old and New, is divinely inspired and useful for doctrine, as it is written, the Book of Psalms, like a paradise containing in itself (the fruits) all the others, gives forth songs, and with them also shows its own songs in psalmody (cantus edit, et proprios insuper cum ipsis inter psallendum exhibet). Such are the words of Athanasius (Epist. Ad Marcell. Op. cit. no. 2), who rightly adds in the same place: "To me it seems that the psalms for him who sings them are as a mirror in which he may contemplate himself and the movements of his soul and, under this influence, recite them" (op. cit. no. 12).
