FROM THE RECTOR - Sunday in the Octave/St. Stephen Protomartyr

It is not uncommon for some to question why there are several martyrs celebrated during the Octave of Christmas. The sorrow of martyrdom appears to contradict the joy of Christmas creating an unpleasant juxtaposition of realities. However, Our Mother, the Church is ever wise, and She properly instructs us as to the fullness of the mystery of the Incarnation. There is a profound sense of rightness about celebrating St. Stephen immediately after welcoming the Christ child into the world. The baby we adore, celebrate and rejoice in will grow to be the man who sheds His blood for us. Moreover, the cross is not a stumbling to the joy of Christmas, but the true gateway to enter more deeply into the mystery of the God dwelling among us. We cannot accept the joy and peace of the Incarnation unless we are also prepared to accept the joy and peace of the Crucifixion. Sacred Scripture speaks of the radiance of the face of Saint Stephen as he stood on the precipice of martyrdom. That measure of peace in the face of so much suffering and sacrifice can only be achieved through a profound love of God and a confidence in His Divine Providence. Developing that love, confidence and trust begins with kneeling before a helpless child and proclaiming Him King of kings and Lord of lords. St. Stephen is *the first of the witnesses of Christ, it is therefore only right that he should appear first in the glorious procession of saints who surround the cradle of the Savior.* As we contemplate the joy of Christmas throughout this Octave, let us rejoice with St. Stephen and all the martyrs who have shed their blood in service to Christ and along with these great witnesses let our sacrifices envelope the cradle of Our Savior.

In order to better facilitate the blessing of Epiphany water, no outside containers will be allowed this year. Enough water and salt will be blessed and made available to the faithful after Holy Mass and for as long as the water remains. For the Feast of the Epiphany in addition to the normal 7 am Holy Mass, we will also celebrate High Mass at 12:15 pm with confessions heard at 11 am.
