# FROM THE RECTOR – 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday after Epiphany

It is far too easy to place our confidence in the things we know, understand, and see. As a consequence, the temptation presents itself to trust in our natural abilities and the things of the world rather than to trust and find confidence in the Lord. When the Lord heals in our Gospel today it is not only to manifest His Messianic power but also an opportunity to trust in the Lord who does truly desire to heal us. The leper and the centurion, from different worlds, different classes, suffering different things but they both share a trust in the Lord's promises. They approach, they ask, and their requests made in faith are granted as the fruit of that very faith. We do not always receive everything we ask for in prayer, but we always receive that which we need from God. What is required from us is the humility to trust in the Lord as we seek His healing power, the faith and confidence that God's providence will provide and then joyful hearts that proclaim the glory of God made manifest in our own lives.

## CANDLEMAS CELEBRATION: 2 February @ 6:30 pm

On Wednesday, 2 February 2022 @ 6:30 pm we will celebrate the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary traditionally known as Candlemas. After our entrance procession we will bless candles.

After the blessing of Candles, they will be distributed at the communion rail and then will be lit by the servers. Weather permitting, we will have a outdoor procession around the Church celebrating the Light of Christ. If they weather does not cooperate, our procession will proceed inside of the Church.

The candles also will be lit and held during the proclamation of the Gospel and then lit again from the Sanctus until the reception of Holy Communion. The candles can be taken home for your personal spiritual use and there will be more candles available on the Oratory table in the back of Church. Please take only those candles that are needed.

#### DEPOSITIO ALLELUIA: 12 February @ 8:15 am

Farewell to the Alleluia on the Saturday before 1 Vespers of Septuagesima: The *deposition* (discontinuance) of the Alleluia on the eve of Septuagesima assumed in medieval times a solemn and emotional note of saying farewell to the beloved song. Although Pope Alexander II had ordered a very simple and somber way of 'deposing' the Alleluia, a variety of farewell customs prevailed in many countries up to the sixteenth century and beyond. They were inspired by the sentiment which Bishop William Durandus (d. 1296) voiced in his commentaries on the Divine Office: 'We part from the Alleluia as from a beloved friend, whom we embrace many times and kiss on mouth, head and hand, before we leave him.' The Oratory will offer Holy Mass on Saturday, 12 February @ 8:15 am and following Holy Mass we will bury the Alleluia at the Blessed Mother's altar. Confessions will be heard before Holy Mass @ 7:00 am. All are encouraged and invited to attend.

### AN UNFORTUNATE HAPPENSTANCE

After the 11:30 am Holy Mass this past Sunday a person or persons who are not members of the Oratory carted off all the water bottles with Epiphany water and all the small salt containers with Epiphany salt and half of the blessed chalk.

1. If you were present when this happened and know the people involved, I would appreciate that information. The Oratory is blessed with a great many resources not available at other parishes and we welcome others to have access to these resources. Nevertheless, what happened yesterday was nothing short of theft. There were still at least 200/300 bottles of water remaining for our own faithful to access along with a similar amount of salt. To take all of it off the table along with the baskets is selfish and unwarranted.

2. We are working to replace these bottles and hopefully will have new ones in the next week or so. Since we blessed a large quantity of water, please feel free to bring your own containers for water. If you need/want more than a gallon, please contact me so that I can keep track of how much water remains. So too, we are hoping to have more salt available, but we did not bless as much salt as we did water.

#### CATECHESIS ON CONFESSION

The Catechism of the Council of Trent provides a thorough and complete explication of the Sacrament of Penance. I want to draw particular attention to the exhortation that confession should be complete and entire. The Church teaches us that we are responsible for confessing all of our mortal sins in both number (how often) and kind (nature of the sin itself). As such when we come for confession, we should not only present those sins that are on our hearts or that have easily come to mind but also confess all sins we can recall after a thorough examination of conscience.

Moreover, please keep in mind that if we are aware of mortal sin, we should not present ourselves for Holy Communion; rather, we should approach the sacrament of confession at the first available opportunity, confess our sins and only then come forward for Holy Communion. One should never feel embarrassed or ashamed to remain in the pew during the reception of Holy Communion because there are a host of reasons why people refrain from receiving Holy Communion and not all of those reasons are connected to mortal sin.

While the Oratory has increased the times for confession, I am aware that these times may not always be convenient for the various schedules we keep. If the times for confession do not work well with your schedule, I am always willing to meet you in Church for the sacrament itself. Finally, I encourage everyone to access a thorough and complete guide for examining your conscience. This will assist you in recalling your serious sins as well as venial sins which also work against growing in holiness
