FROM THE RECTOR - Passion Sunday

I continue to be amazed by the richness and beauty of the encounter with truth that is experienced in celebrating the Traditional Latin Mass. One of the great sources of spiritual richness for me is the structure of the liturgical calendar and how it assists us in not only celebrating the Paschal Mystery but forces us to penetrate more deeply into these mysteries. This dynamic is made manifest in our celebration this Sunday of Passion Sunday. In the new calendar, Passion Sunday and Palm Sunday are collapsed into one reality which is an unfortunate occurrence precisely because entrance into the Lord's Passion and Death requires not only recalling His triumphal entrance into Jerusalem (Palm Sunday) but also meditating on the hardness of heart, hatred of truth and rejection of God that was swirling around Our Lord before and during His entrance into the Holy City. Passion Sunday inserts us into the events surrounding our Lord and leading to His Passion and Death. This profound meditation on these Sacred Mysteries forces us to acknowledge our own sins and their contribution to the Lord's suffering. The veiled images we encounter in Church today, which will remain that way until the joyous proclamation of Easter, serve as liturgical reminders to strive to find the Lord at all times especially when He might be obscured by our doubts, fears, and sin. Let us entreat the Holy Spirit to provide us with strength and courage to die with Christ in order that we might truly live with Him!

THOUGHTS ON PASSIONTIDE VEILING

As we move closer to the holiest days of the Church year, it is helpful to meditate upon the veiling of statues and the removal of the relics. Thank you to Anna Kalinowski for providing this succinct, timely and most especially, prayerful information.

- 1) The Gospel of Passion Sunday, John 8 46:59 says, "They took up stones therefore to cast at Him: but Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple." This reminds us of the humiliation to which Our Lord subjected Himself in hiding from the Pharisees. And, if the Master's glory is eclipsed, it is but right the servants (the statues of Our Lady and the Saints) also be so. Thus, they are veiled.
- 2) Furthermore, the veiling increases the breathtaking suspense of the great mysteries by carrying on that progressive stripping that takes place in Septuagesima and Lent. In Septuagesima, flowers are no longer used. In Passiontide, the relics are taken away and the statues hidden. Finally, after the Liturgy of Holy Thursday, the altars themselves (except the altar of repose) are stripped bare to show the desolation of Good Friday.
- 3) The crucifixes are unveiled on Good Friday, which beautifully highlights the primacy of the Cross for salvation. Good Friday is the climax, even the crown jewel of the Triduum. The rest of the statues are unveiled at the Easter Vigil during the Gloria. This highlights the joy of Heaven won only through the Crucifixion.

OFFICE OF TENEBRAE

"Tenebrae" is the name given to the service of Matins and Lauds belonging to the last three days of Holy Week and normatively anticipated the evening before. These services are marked by a somber and sober, nearly mournful praying of the Divine Office. The structure of the office is sparse reflecting the seriousness of these sacred days and the sadness that should accompany all of us because Christ our Savior suffered for our sins.

The Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine will have the opportunity to pray Tenebrae on the following evenings:

- Wednesday, 13 April @ 9:00 pm Tenebrae of Holy Thursday
- Thursday, 14 April @ 9:00 pm Tenebrae of Good Friday
- Friday, 15 April @ 9:00 pm Tenebrae of Holy Saturday

This is a wonderful, solemn, and profound way to enter more deeply into the Sacred Triduum and the Paschal Mystery which has brought us our salvation.
