FROM THE RECTOR – Palm Sunday

The reflections on this day provided by Holy Mother Church are simple and because of their simplicity extremely profound. The Church teaches us that the liturgical reality we celebrate reflects the twofold the Church has toward the Cross. The sacred liturgy begins with the blessing of palms, includes a procession calling to the mind the Lord's joyful and triumphal entrance into Jerusalem. All aspects of the blessing, distribution, and procession with palms evokes in us the scene that took place two thousand years ago when the Savior entered His city in order to redeem His people. The Holy Mass follows the ceremonies related to the palms and forces the faithful to confront the sorrow of the Redeemer's Passion and the part our sins have played in the Lord's suffering. Through today's celebrations, we are one step closer to entrance into the holiest of days where we recall the triumph of life over death, celebrate the victory of mercy and sacrifice over selfishness and sin. All of our preparations during this Lenten pilgrimage were undertaken in large part to assist us in not turning away from the horror of the cross in order to be able to rejoice in the victory the cross brings. We suffer! Yet, Christ conquers sin, suffering, and death on the cross. Let us rejoice and give thanks to God!

THOUGHTS ON PASSIONTIDE VEILING

As we move closer to the holiest days of the Church year, it is helpful to meditate upon the veiling of statues and the removal of the relics. Thank you to Anna Kalinowski for providing this succinct, timely and most especially, prayerful information.

1) The Gospel of Passion Sunday, John 8 46:59 says, "They took up stones therefore to cast at Him: but Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple." This reminds us of the humiliation to which Our Lord subjected Himself in hiding from the Pharisees. And, if the Master's glory is eclipsed, it is but right the servants (the statues of Our Lady and the Saints) also be so. Thus, they are veiled.

2) Furthermore, the veiling increases the breathtaking suspense of the great mysteries by carrying on that progressive stripping that takes place in Septuagesima and Lent. In Septuagesima, flowers are no longer used. In Passiontide, the relics are taken away and the statues hidden. Finally, after the Liturgy of Holy Thursday, the altars themselves (except the altar of repose) are stripped bare to show the desolation of Good Friday.

3) The crucifixes are unveiled on Good Friday, which beautifully highlights the primacy of the Cross for salvation. Good Friday is the climax, even the crown jewel of the Triduum. The rest of the statues are unveiled at the Easter Vigil during the Gloria. This highlights the joy of Heaven won only through the Crucifixion.
