FROM THE RECTOR - Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost

This Sunday we read the parable of the Good Samaritan. Recent tradition and reading of this great parable have exclusively focused on the manner we are to care for our brothers and sisters, and the generosity that should be the hallmark of all Catholic believers. While there is definitely truth in this understanding, it is preceded by the more traditional understanding of the Good Samaritan as a manifestation and explanation for Christ's presence in the world. The Lord has come to care for the wounds created by our sinfulness, to heal, and bind them for us. Moreover, not only does He tend to our souls, He also places us within the care of the Church, the spiritual inn that provides us comfort and allows us to heal. As we meditate on this parable and the wisdom of our Savior, let us first thank Him for His mercy and solicitude. Then, with grateful hearts, let us pledge to give to others that which we ourselves receive: compassion, mercy, and love to all we meet!

*****DAILY MASS THIS WEEK*****

There will be NO DAILY MASS, 8/29-9/2, due to repairs from the flood damage that we incurred several weeks ago. There is lead paint in the sacristy ceiling so we are required to have an environmental company do the lead abatement. They instructed us yesterday that we will need to seal off the surrounding areas until their work is completed (which they anticipate no more than 5 days). The surrounding areas include the priest's sacristy, the server sacristy, and the sanctuary.

CHANGE OF MASS TIMES

When the Oratory began celebrating the 6:45 am Holy Mass in May of 2022, it was in response to the Covid mandates for social distancing. At that time, the Oratory was blessed with the generosity of priests who were willing and able to make a stable commitment in offering Holy Mass each Sunday. In the intervening two years the availability of those particular priests coupled with the implications of the recent motu proprio, maintaining three Holy Masses on Sunday is no longer viable. As such, beginning Sunday, 4 September 2022, the Oratory will return to its original schedule of Sunday Masses at 8:00 am (Low Mass) and 11:30 am (Solemn/Sung Mass). My apologies for those who have regularly assisted at the 6:45 am Holy Mass. Hopefully, this change will present only a minor inconvenience. It is also a hope that those who have assisted at 6:45 am will have the opportunity to come to know those who regularly attend the 8:00 am and 11:30 am Holy Masses.
