#### CANDLEMAS CELEBRATION: 2 FEBRUARY @ 6:00 pm

Thursday, 2 February 2023, we will celebrate the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, traditionally known as Candlemas. Sung Mass will be celebrated at the normal time of 7:00 am.

The traditional blessing of candles will take place in the evening at 6:00 pm. Candles will be blessed immediately upon the entrance of the sacred ministers. After the blessing of Candles, they will be distributed at the communion rail and then they will be lit by the servers. Weather permitting, we will have an outdoor procession around the Church celebrating the Light of Christ (please dress accordingly). If they weather does not cooperate, our procession will proceed inside of the Church. At the conclusion of the procession, the community will celebrate Vespers.

The candles can be taken home for your personal spiritual use and there will be more candles available on the Oratory table in the back of Church. Please take only those candles that are needed.

The faithful are allowed to bring their own candles for blessing. Candles should be brought only on that day and placed on the tables provided that will be near the altar of the Blessed Mother prior to Holy Mass. Candles should be accessible to be blessed with holy water and be marked clearly with the name of the person/family that is having them blessed. Finally, all candles must be retrieved at the conclusion of Holy Mass. Any candles that are not retrieved at the conclusion of Holy Mass will be distributed by the Oratory. #### **CATECHESIS ON CONFESSION**

Last year I shared a few insights on the nature of the sacrament of confession. I want to take this opportunity to offer again a few words on the nature of our confessions needing to be entire and complete and based not on emotion only.

The Catechism of the Council of Trent provides a thorough and complete explication of the Sacrament of Penance. I want to draw particular attention to the exhortation that confession should be complete and entire. The Church teaches us that we are responsible for confessing all of our mortal sins in both number (how often) and kind (nature of the sin itself). As such when we come for confession, we should not only present those sins that are on our hearts or that have easily come to mind but also confess all sins we can recall after a thorough examination of conscience.

I encourage everyone to access a thorough and complete guide for examining your conscience. This will assist you in recalling your serious sins as well as venial sins which also work against growing in holiness. A good examination of conscience will also provide the requisite detachment from the emotions that are often associated with the sins for which we are guilt. There are situations where we might feel bad about a particular interaction, situation, but no sin was involved and then there are times when we have grown so accustomed to our sins that we no longer feel guilt about them and fail to confess them. Prepare well for the sacrament so that you can also use well the graces received.

#### **ORATORY TITHING**

I am most grateful for the immediate response to our on-going financial responsibilities. Despite the challenges we face, the Oratory community continues to grow with new families joining each month. #### ENTERING THE SANCTUARY

There has been an excessive amount of traffic coming through the sanctuary in recent months. Refraining from entering the sanctuary will invigorate our sense of sacred space and foster a deeper reverence for the sanctuary as that place where the Living God dwells. If there is a need to speak to the priest or other sacred ministers after Holy Mass, the faithful are asked to approach the sacristy through the server's entrance and not to enter the sanctuary proper. The door for the server's sacristy is located east of the Church off of the parking lot between the Church and the school; please knock on the door and someone will let you in. In advance, your cooperation in this is greatly appreciated.

#### FROM THE RECTOR

It remains a fundamental weakness of the human person to trust more in himself than to trust in God. Of course, this self-reliance got Adam and Eve in trouble and set the stage for the difficulties with which we continue to struggle today. The Lord only and always speaks truth to us, telling us of His love and care for us. All that He asks in return is obedient trust. And yet, we still allow anxiety and fear to stand in the way of our faith in God and the promises He has fulfilled in Christ. In St. Matthew's Gospel today, Christ makes clear His power over all things, calming both the storm and the fear of His apostles. Even in the face of this reality, the apostles still wonder who Christ is. We know more than the apostles with 2000 years of lived faith and yet the question the Lord asks remains true: Why are you fearful? The exhortation to trust was begun in the Gospel last week when both the leper and the centurion trusted in the power of the Lord to heal and to make whole. Now Holy Mother Church asks us to look even deeper into the power of fear to paralyze us. Aware that there are many reasons to be concerned about the world and the Church, we are still required to trust in the Lord and never allow fear to stand in the way. Moreover, we must guard ourselves from the doubt and delusion that fear engenders causing us to place our confidence in the world instead of trusting in God's Divine Providence. Pray earnestly, fervently to always trust in the Lord most especially in the face of trial and tribulation.


