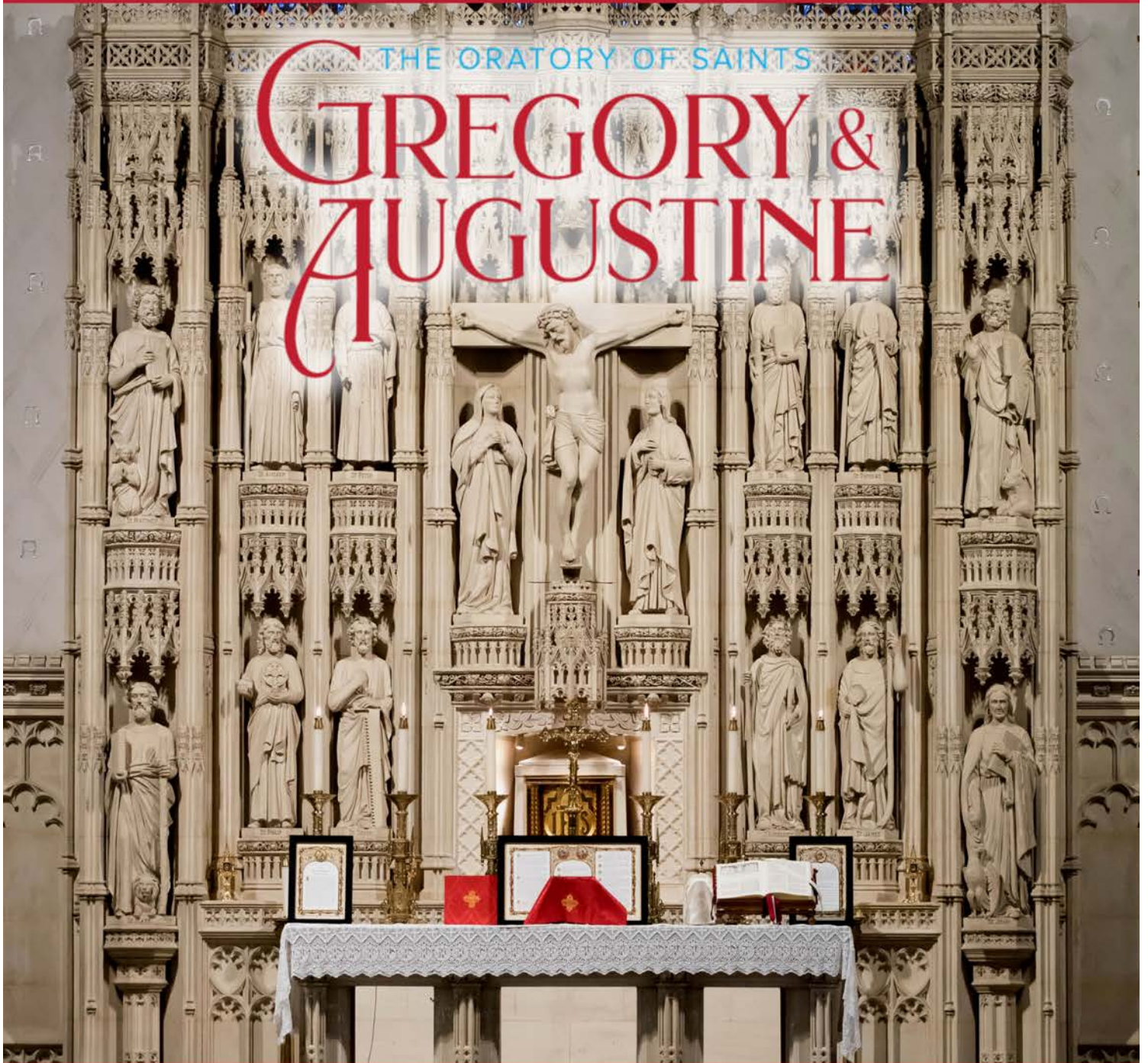

*From the desk of Msgr. Morris*

Dear Faithful of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine:

It has not been since the Covid lockdown that I have written directly to our ever-growing community. During those days, we all struggled with the cross of being separated from our beloved Church and the Most Holy Eucharist. Sadly, I write to you now bringing before you another cross that we will need to bear going forward.

It was communicated to me on 15 March 2023, that Fr. Blake, the Pastor of St. Luke the Evangelist, and Carolina Diaz-Silva, the Director of the International School, crafted an amendment to the lease agreement between the parish and the International School. Effectively immediately, the International School has exclusive use of the ground floor of the school building and the first floor in their entirety, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Prior to this amendment, the ground floor, where we have had coffee hour for the last several weeks, was available to the parish and the Oratory after 6 pm on weekdays and all day on Saturdays and Sundays. This no longer exists. It has been communicated that we are to remove anything that belongs to the Oratory from the ground floor immediately.

What this means for our community, practically, is that we are no longer able to hold any events on the ground floor of the school. Because of our increased numbers, coffee hour is suspended until such time as we can devise a plan that will allow us to socialize with room to breathe. The Days of Recollection will continue, but we will be eating in the St. Joseph Room. The celebration after the Easter Vigil is cancelled. The Mother's Day brunch will happen, but in the St. Joseph Room. Any other events that were scheduled to be in the ground floor of the school are cancelled.

This is an extremely unfortunate situation, of which I was completely unaware. Despite what I perceived to be good working relationship this turn of events has blindsided me. I am unable to provide you any rationale for both the decision itself and the timing of the decision; again, all of this came out of the blue. I did reach out to the Archdiocesan leadership to see what, if any, recourse we might have and it was communicated to me that we have none. Even though our financial generosity has greatly contributed to the maintenance of the Church and other buildings and has greatly assisted St. Luke the Evangelist, our status as an Oratory gives us no legal rights when it comes to the school building. In his email to me informing me of this development, Fr. Blake stated that Ms. Diaz-Silva requested this change to "ensure her stable future for the next nine years" and he agreed to this request because she is "a valuable asset and tenant". While he has assisted her in securing her future for an institution that has nothing to do with mission of the Catholic Church, he has also seriously limited the mission and future of the Catholic entity that should be considered a valuable asset as well.

I remain confused and saddened by these developments. Fortunately, we still have access to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor of the School for our Co-Op and CCD programs. We are also allowed to use the playground on Sundays. So too, as we move into warmer weather it will be easier for us to do what we initially did and gather in the parking lot to socialize with each other.

There is the temptation to spend unnecessary energy trying to make sense of this which is hard to do. There is the temptation to anger, resentment, and frustration given all the good that is happening at the Oratory. However, we must guard against these temptations and praise the Lord for providing another cross for us to carry during Lent. We must also intensify our prayer during these final weeks of the process of All Things New, particularly that the anticipated changes will provide greater stability and autonomy for the Oratory to continue the mission entrusted to us. Finally, please pray for your rector who desperately needs and relies upon your prayers. Know that you all are in my daily prayers, multiple times each day.

Our Lady of Walsingham, pray for us!

**FROM THE RECTOR**

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally called Laetare Sunday taking its name from the opening words of the Introit: *Rejoice, O Jerusalem!* Our joy is exhorted not only because our Lenten pilgrimage has considerably advanced but also and more importantly because we are yet again reminded of the power of Christ’s salvific work on the Cross. The Church reminds us through the sacred liturgy and the Divine Office of the work of our Heavenly Father with His Chosen people: setting them free from slavery in Egypt; feeding them with manna; giving them the Law on Mount Sinai on their sojourn to the Promised Land. Moses is God’s prophet, but in Christ we have Moses fulfilled. And the work of Christ frees us from the slavery to sin, feeds us with His own Body and delivers us to the new Jerusalem in Heaven. These are all reasons to rejoice and give thanks to God. The uncertainties of the world and the Church call us to trust in the Lord and the fulfillment of His promises which is given to us each time we celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Continue your Lenten journey with diligence and joy. Now, more than ever, do not waver or stumble carrying your cross. The age in which we live is, at times, truly difficult for us all but it also provides us the opportunity to configure ourselves to Christ crucified. And for that opportunity, let us rejoice in the Lord!
