THOUGHTS ON PASSIONTIDE VEILING

As we move closer to the holiest days of the Church year, it is helpful to meditate upon the veiling of statues and the removal of the relics. Thank you to Anna Kalinowski for providing this succinct, timely and most especially, prayerful information.

- 1) The Gospel of Passion Sunday, John 8 46:59 says, "They took up stones therefore to cast at Him: but Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple." This reminds us of the humiliation to which Our Lord subjected Himself in hiding from the Pharisees. And, if the Master's glory is eclipsed, it is but right the servants (the statues of Our Lady and the Saints) also be so. Thus, they are veiled
- 2) Furthermore, the veiling increases the breathtaking suspense of the great mysteries by carrying on that progressive stripping that takes place in Septuagesima and Lent. In Septuagesima, flowers are no longer used. In Passiontide, the relics are taken away and the statues hidden. Finally, after the Liturgy of Holy Thursday, the altars themselves (except the altar of repose) are stripped bare to show the desolation of Good Friday.
- 3) The crucifixes are unveiled on Good Friday, which beautifully highlights the primacy of the Cross for salvation. Good Friday is the climax, even the crown jewel of the Triduum. The rest of the statues are unveiled at the Easter Vigil during the Gloria. This highlights the joy of Heaven won only through the Crucifixion.

THE ALTAR OF REPOSE:

On Holy Thursday, from the hours of 9:00 pm to Midnight, the faithful of the Oratory will have the opportunity to adore the Eucharistic Lord at the altar of repose (the Marian altar). Dom Gueranger tells us: "After having stripped the high altar, the celebrant takes off the cloths from the other altars that are in the church. An air of desolation pervades the temple of God. The very tabernacle has lost its divine Guest. The ciborium (in which the blessed Sacrament is reserved for Viaticum) has been taken to the place where reposes the chalice containing the Body of our Lord. The Majesty of our God has withdrawn to that mysterious sanctuary, into which we enter not but with silence and compunction."

It is customary for this place of Our Lord's repose to reflect as much of the beauty and majesty of Our Lord as human efforts can provide. Thus, the altar of repose will be decorated with precious fabrics, live flowers, candles, pearls, crystals, and even ostrich feathers. OFFICE OF TENEBRAE

"Tenebrae" is the name given to the service of Matins and Lauds belonging to the last three days of Holy Week and normatively anticipated the evening before. These services are marked by a somber and sober, nearly mournful praying of the Divine Office. The structure of the office is sparse reflecting the seriousness of these sacred days and the sadness that should accompany all of us because Christ our Savior suffered for our sins.

The Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine will have the opportunity to pray Tenebrae on the following evenings:

- Wednesday, 5 April @ 9:00 pm Tenebrae of Holy Thursday
- Thursday, 6 April @ 9:00 pm Tenebrae of Good Friday
- Friday, 7 April @ 9:00 pm Tenebrae of Holy Saturday

This is a solemn and profound way to enter more deeply into the Sacred Triduum and the Paschal Mystery which has brought us our salvation.
