Second Sunday after Easter

The Second Sunday after Easter is traditionally known as Good Shepherd Sunday reminding the newly baptized and initiated members of the faith to cling to Christ the Good Shepherd. This also serves as a reminder to all members of the family of God that they are to hold fast to the faith that is rooted in the Cross of Christ. In the Epistle St. Peter reminds us of the price paid by Christ for our transgressions. He also reminds us that the Lord's sufferings are the example we should follow in our daily lives. The only way for us to carry our daily crosses is to allow the voice of God to lead and guide us. And, in order for us to hear His voice we must put aside self-directedness, willfulness, and pride. St. Peter reminds us: *"For you were as sheep going astray: but you are now converted to the shepherd and bishop of your souls."* To grow in humility, the cardinal virtue to deepen our trust in the Lord, requires a willingness to be humiliated. I would encourage the daily praying of the Litany of Humility attributed to and popularized by Cardinal Merry del Val. This great servant of God, Cardinal del Val, was known for his priestly zeal and pastoral charity coupled with a profound love of Christ and Holy Mother the Church. The Cardinal credits his growth in the virtue of humility as key to his ability to better cooperate with the graces of God. So, it must be for us as well. We must strive to grow in the virtue of humility to allow the other graces of God to flow easily in our lives. Christ is the Good Shepherd who cares deeply for the well-being, both spiritual and physical, of His sheep. For our part, we must rejoice in being members of His flock, docile and obedient to His voice so that we might also respond generously and promptly to His will.
