<u>CONFIRMATION AND FIRST HOLY</u> <u>COMMUNION</u>

The Oratory is blessed again to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation and the reception of First Holy Communion. On Saturday, 10 June 2023 @ 9:00 am we will celebrate both Confirmation and First Holy Communion. There are 23 children receiving Confirmation and 15 children receiving First Holy Communion. As is our custom, we will celebrate Confirmation and then immediately celebrate Holy Mass during which our First Communicants will receive Our Eucharistic Lord. Please pray for the young people preparing to receive these sacraments and for their parents and catechesis.

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION

The External Solemnity of Corpus Christi will be celebrated on Sunday, 11 June 2023. The Oratory is blessed to have a Corpus Christi procession through the streets of Richmond Heights. The procession will begin immediately after the conclusion of the 11:30 am Holy Mass. In addition to our First Communicants, (and other First Communicants who would have made their First Holy Communion in a different parish this year), the procession will include a Knights of Columbus Honor Guard, the choir & schola leading us in various hymns and the opportunity during our procession to pray the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet and other prayers to assist us in giving fitting glory and praise to our Eucharistic Lord. All parishioners are encouraged to attend and to invite others to walk with Our Lord.

Solemnity of Pentecost 2023

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weekend the Church throughout the world celebrates the Solemnity of Pentecost, and so commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, the foundation of the Church, and the beginning of her mission to all nations and peoples.

The mystery of Pentecost exhorts us to prayer and commitment to mission. The Holy Spirit inspires faith, hope, and charity in the hearts of the faithful, and ennobles the numerous and varied ways of transmitting the Christian message according to the culture and customs of all times and places. While giving us access to communion with God in prayer, the Holy Spirit also prompts us towards service of our neighbor by encountering him, by reconciliation, by witness, by a desire for justice and peace, by renewal of outlook, by social progress, and missionary commitment.

Almost two years ago, we as an Archdiocese embarked upon a strategic pastoral planning process, *All Things New*. We prayed to the Holy Spirit for guidance, and we committed ourselves to you the faithful of this Archdiocese. An extensive process of listening was undertaken in all the parishes. Thereafter, I consulted the Archdiocesan Presbyteral Council regarding every parish under consideration. I then spent time in further prayer, study, and discernment, after which I reached the following decision regarding the Oratory of Sts. Gregory and Augustine.

The oratory will remain unchanged regarding its present structure, and the Reverend Monsignor C. Eugene Morris, rector, who is currently assigned to provide pastoral care at the oratory will continue to do so. I have appointed the Reverend Michael Rennier, as vice-rector, effective August 1, 2023. Please warmly welcome him.

While there is no change to the structure, in this moment in the Archdiocese, we are all called to rededicate ourselves to the new modes of evangelization and social outreach. I ask that you join me in praying for those among the faithful of the Archdiocese who will be hearing challenging news this weekend regarding their parish.

Please join me in praying that the Holy Spirit will draw us all closer together as we commit ourselves to following the Lord Jesus and spreading His message by the witness of our lives. Sincerely yours in Christ,

Trinity Sunday

The beauty of the mysteries of Christ and their lived expression in the life of Holy Mother the Church is that we are never able to exhaust them. We are able to contemplate for lifetimes the blessings given to us through the redemptive work of Christ and in all those lifetimes we would never deplete the well-spring of mercy, love, and holiness into which we have been invited by Christ. Today's celebration of the Most Holy Trinity places before us the central, foundational mystery of our Catholic lives: the Father, Son and Holy Spirit from whom all goodness comes and this same Trinity of persons to whom we all desire to return. In Her wisdom and love, our Mother the Church provokes our hearts and minds to a contemplation of the Trinity immediately after celebrating the descent of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Abbot Rupert, writing in the twelfth century, beautifully expresses this wonderful relationship: "As soon as we have celebrated the coming of the Holy Ghost, we hail in song the feast of the Holy Trinity, the following Sunday, a well-chosen place in the calendar, for immediately after the descent of the Holy Spirit, preaching and conversion began and faith through baptism and confession in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost." How blessed to have revealed to us this perfect communion. Let us also be mindful of the great responsibility bestowed upon us at our own baptisms into this blessed communion to go and preach, teach and baptize in the name of Triune God. Take time this week to revisit the Sacred Scripture from today's Holy Mass and strive to enter more deeply into this great and august Mystery!
