CANTORES SANCTI LUDOVICI

FROM the earliest centuries of the Church's history, laymen and lesser ministers have established different structures to assist their clergy. Among the most ancient and revered of these institutions is the Roman *Schola cantorum* ('school of singers'), consisting of men devoted to chanting the official prayers that Holy Mother Church has always guarded as her richest sources of Grace: the Holy Mass and the Divine Office. In keeping with this tradition, Msgr. Morris asked me to look into establishing such a Schola as part of the Oratory of Sts. Gregory and Augustine. Just over one year later, our Schola received IRS-approved 501(c)(3) status as a non-profit organization under the title *Cantores Sancti Ludovici*.

By the Grace of God, this status allows us to raise funds so that our Schola may serve the Church as a full-time entity. Our principal aim at this time is to enrich the spiritual life of the Oratory's faithful, both families and individual members, in the first place by singing the divine praises on their behalf and inviting them to participate in the venerable chants of the Divine Office. It is our hope to offer to our parishioners and pilgrims the same daily cycle of liturgical worship that finds glorious expression in traditional Benedictine monasteries like Gower and Clear Creek. Building naturally upon these liturgical foundations are our intellectual apostolates: courses, lectures, and publications on Gregorian chant, medieval theology and Biblical commentaries, Latin, and the liberal arts, all offered by respected scholars.

The tradition of the *Schola cantorum*, which originated with God's primary revelation to the Hebrews in the Old Testament and which was exquisitely enriched by the Catholic Church for nearly two millennia, has gone virtually extinct outside of the monastic setting during the last century. For us securely to establish our Schola in St. Louis, it is essential that the *Cantores* achieve financial stability both on a yearly basis and ultimately with an endowment. At this time, we hope that donations for our various apostolates will amount to \$100,000 annually, to cover the lodging and living expenses of two full-time cantors, part-time and guest cantors, a library, and different academic projects.
