### HOLY MASS: 10- 14 JULY

There will be no public Masses the week of 10 July 2023 due to necessary repairs to the ceiling of the sacristy and work being done on the server's sacristy. Almost a year ago the sacristy roof leaked severely during the heavy rain the St. Louis area experienced in late July 2022. The damage to the roof caused serious damage to the ceiling of the sacristy creating several holes in the ceiling along with destruction of the paint on the ceiling and parts of the walls in the sacristy. Repairs could not begin on the inside until the roof was fixed, and it took almost a year to fix the roof. With the completion of the roof, the ceiling can now be repaired, and it will take the whole week to complete this project. During this week, access to the sacristy will be severely limited and the noise will make it difficult to celebrate Holy Mass. The Mass intentions scheduled for that week will be fulfilled. # 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost

### FROM THE RECTOR

The Lessons for the Sixth Sunday after Pentecost encourage our reflection on the sacraments of baptism and the Most Holy Eucharist. The sacramental life of the Church, especially these two great sacraments, provides us the means by which we not only receive sanctifying grace from God but also through that grace are able to render worthy praise and adoration to Him. As Paul reminds the Romans, baptism is the means by which we are able to share fully in the Paschal Mystery of our Savior. To die with Christ in baptism is also to live with Him and the restored, reborn life He gained for us on the cross. Of course, baptism and confirmation are the proper preparation for the reception of the Most Holy Eucharist. The Lord gives us Himself in the Eucharist so that we will have constant contact with the powerful effects of the cross. We should never take for granted the gifts given to us in our Catholic faith through the sacraments; so too, we should guard against underestimating the power of God's grace given through baptism and the Eucharist. Our hope for the world, our Church and ourselves is founded on the manifestation of God's love for us present in the sacraments. Let us strive to live this week alive in Christ Jesus our Lord!
