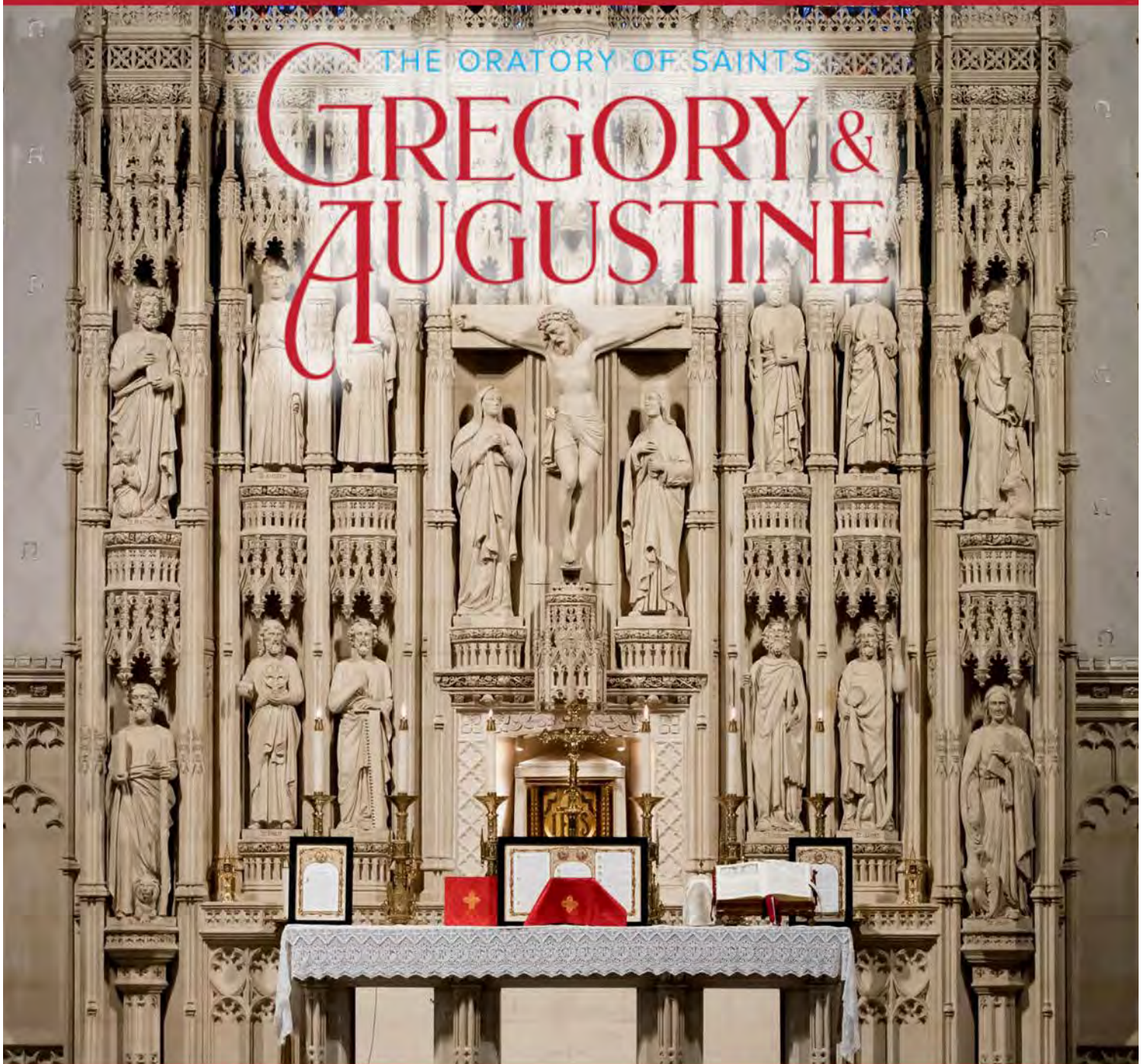

NEW MASS SCHEDULE

With the implementation of All Things New, the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine is now provided the opportunity to celebrate Holy Mass at times that best benefit the faithful and also allow the celebration of more daily Masses and confessions. (Anticipated changes noted in **bold**.)

DEVOTIONAL PRACTICES/SPACES

Near the ambo, a space has been dedicated to the statue of Our Lady of Walsingham for devotion and prayer. As she is the patroness of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory & Augustine, all our encouraged to spend time in prayer with Her.

Plans are currently underway to create devotional areas for the statues of Ss. Gregory and Augustine. These statues have not been publicly displayed since 2018. The areas near the old confessionals located near the altars of the Blessed Mother and Saint Joseph will become the new homes for St. Gregory and St. Augustine. This necessitates the removal of two pews on both sides of those sections; two of the pews will remain in the back of Church for necessary seating.

**Finally, beginning Tuesday, 5 September 2023, the Oratory will celebrate Perpetual Help Devotion after both daily Masses.**

**FROM THE RECTOR**
