<u>VITA COMMUNIS - THE ORATORY OF SS.</u> <u>GREGORY AND AUGUSTINE YOUNG ADULTS</u>

As St. Augustine of Canterbury worked to guide his English flock from paganism to the true Faith, he exchanged many letters with his pontiff St. Gregory the Great back in Rome. Near the end of the 6th century, St. Gregory sent this instruction to St. Augustine:

"But as for them that liveth according to the vita communis (common life), what need I to speak now, either what portions they give, or what hospitality they shall keep, or what work of mercy they shall fulfill, seeing that it is commanded them that all which is superfluous should be employed unto godly and devout uses?"

In honor of their dear patrons, the young adults of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine have taken this phrase Vita Communis (the common life) as the title of their community which exists within the larger Oratory community. The title will serve as a reminder to them to generously devote their lives "unto godly and devout uses" as they come together in prayer, formation, and recreation. In this way, they hope to give ever greater glory to God.

A New Beginning

As Rector of the Oratory of Saints Gregory and Augustine, it is a joy and a privilege to be a part of this community dedicated to the Traditional Holy Mass and Sacraments. In the five years the Oratory has made its home here at St. Luke the Evangelist, we have experienced growth in those at Holy Mass and in the number of organizations and activities taking place. So too, we are now blessed with the presence of Fr. Michael Rennier whose priestly presence allows great availability for Holy Mass and confessions. The addition of Anna Kalinowski to the Oratory staff allows the various organizations currently in existence to better coordinate activities and her presence opens up the opportunity for more activities in the Oratory community.

These five years have not been without challenges, setbacks, and serious difficulties. However, in each situation, not only has the Oratory responded to them with trust and confidence but we have also experienced continued growth, energy, and vitality from every challenge. The other side of this letter lists the new families who have registered since the beginning of All Things New (1 August 2023). The explosion of growth is a clear indicator of the generosity of God's grace and the benefits of our fidelity.

In addition to the increased number of faithful, the Church has undergone some changes to increase our piety and devotional practices. We have created place for Our Lady of Walsingham. Ss. Gregory and Augustine have finally found their home in the oratory dedicated to them. St. Augustine is near the St. Joseph altar and St. Gregory is near the Blessed Mother's Altar and the statue of Our Lady of Walsingham. The Sacred Heart statue is located in the back of Church on the St. Joseph side. Finally, the Holy Water Font has been relocated to the baptistry. Those needing Holy Water should feel comfortable entering the baptistry for their water. At all of these places in our beautiful Church, everyone is encouraged to spend a few moments in prayer asking for the on-going intercession of Our Lord's Sacred Heart, the Blessed Mother, and our patron saints for the continued health and well-being of the Oratory.

While some good work has been done on the inside of the Church, plans are underway to create space on the parking lot between Church and school that will allow for a safer and more amenable place for the community to gather after the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

In the coming weeks, it is my hope to reconstitute the Rector's Council, an advisory board that existed to assist the Rector in the governance of the Oratory. There will be ex officio members of this board; however, if you are interested in serving on the Rector's Council, please contact me directly (<u>rector@oratorysga.org</u>). Of immediate attention for the Rector's Council will be assessing the health of the physical plant; what needs immediate attention; and the process of raising funds to respond to these needs.

These five years have been an experience of grace and blessing. I am excited for what the future will bring to us. I am confident that the Lord will continue to generously reward us as He has done so throughout the history of the Oratory. Please know that you are all in my daily prayers as I continue to rely upon your prayers for me.

FROM THE RECTOR

The exhortation of St. Paul to the Galatians reminds us of the need to walk with and live with the Spirit. While this is a simple statement, the requirement for those who hear it is a reliance upon the virtue of courage. The Holy Spirit holds and binds us together, safeguards the Church from enemies without and within, and enlivens our minds, hearts, and souls to be responsive to the Incarnate Word. What is required from us is trust and confidence in the Holy Spirit. We ask for inspiration and guidance and the Lord hears our prayers; however, the answer may often come in ways we least expect or fail to recognize at all. To become attune to the workings of God requires trust and confidence and these on a daily basis. What St. Paul recommends is the practice of humility, distrusting ourselves, and placing all our trust in the Lord. Be open to those realities that will humble you and rely not upon yourself but trust only in the Lord.
