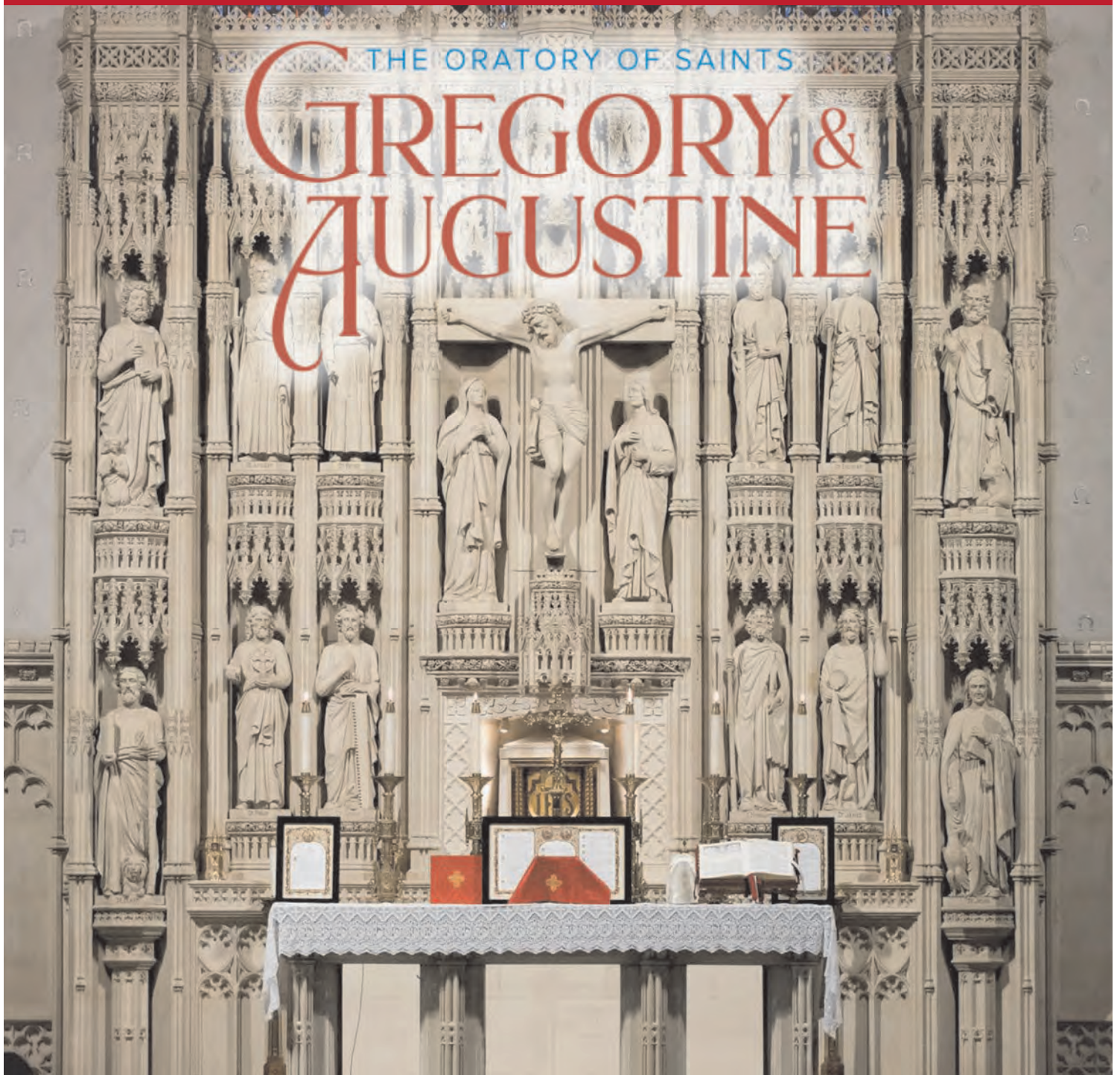

CANDLEMAS CELEBRATION: 2 FEBRUARY @ 12:15 pm

Friday, 2 February 2024, we will celebrate the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary traditionally known as Candlemas. Solemn High Mass will be celebrated at the 12:15 pm Holy Mass.

The traditional blessing of candles will take place at the 12:15 pm Holy Mass. Candles will be blessed immediately upon the entrance of the sacred ministers. After the blessing of Candles, they will be distributed at the communion rail and then they will be lit by the servers. Weather permitting, we will have an outdoor procession around the Church celebrating the Light of Christ (please dress accordingly). If they weather does not cooperate, our procession will proceed inside of the Church.

The candles can be taken home for your personal spiritual use and there will be more candles available on the Oratory table in the back of Church. Please take only those candles that are needed.

The faithful are allowed to bring their own candles for blessing. Candles should be brought only on that day and placed on the tables provided that will be near the altar of the Blessed Mother PRIOR to Holy Mass. Candles should be accessible to be blessed with holy water and be marked clearly with the name of the person/family that is having them blessed. Finally, all candles must be retrieved at the conclusion of Holy Mass. Any candles that are not retrieved at the conclusion of Holy Mass will be distributed by the Oratory. CATECHESIS ON CONFESSION

The beginning of the new calendar is an opportune time to offer a few words on the nature of our confessions. Particularly that when we present ourselves for confession, it is after a complete examination of conscience striving for a full and integral confession aware of our sins and based not on emotion only. So too, those who make frequent confession (which is encouraged) should examine their consciences for the sin of presumption.

The Catechism of the Council of Trent provides a thorough and complete explication of the Sacrament of Penance. I want to draw particular attention to the exhortation that confession should be complete and entire. The Church teaches us that we are responsible for confessing all of our mortal sins in both number (how often) and kind (nature of the sin itself). As such when we come for confession, we should not only present those sins that are on our hearts or that have easily come to mind but also confess all sins we can recall after a thorough examination of conscience.

I encourage everyone to access a thorough and complete guide for examining your conscience. This will assist you in recalling your serious sins as well as venial sins which also work against growing in holiness. A good examination of conscience will also provide the requisite detachment from the emotions that are often associated with the sins for which we are guilty. There are situations where we might

feel bad about a particular interaction, situation, but no sin was involved and then there are times when we have grown so accustomed to our sins that we no longer feel guilt about them and fail to confess them. Prepare well for the sacrament so that you can also use well the graces received.

FROM THE RECTOR

Preparation for the great Lenten Fast begins today! With the Sundays in the seasons of Septuagesima and Lent, the Church provides us the opportunity to consider the fullness of salvation history and the preparation for the redemptive work of Christ that is prepared for in the Old Testament. The lessons from the Divine Office present the history of Adam while the theme of Holy Mass centers on Christ the New Adam. As such, since in the flesh we are sons and daughters of the disobedient Adam, we must work diligently to root out the sinfulness of our lives. The more successful we are in overcoming temptation and sin, the more we are able to put on the new man who is Christ. By relying upon the grace of God, especially those graces given to us at baptism, we are able to become more like the New Adam who reconciled us to the Father through His obedience and sacrifice. As St. Paul reminds us in the epistle, the spiritual life is indeed a race being run and only one victor is crowned. To achieve the crown of glory requires hard work, discipline, and sacrifice. These weeks leading to Ash Wednesday will allow us to seriously consider our disciplines and sacrifices so that we can run the race of salvation well and share in the victory of the Lord's cross.
