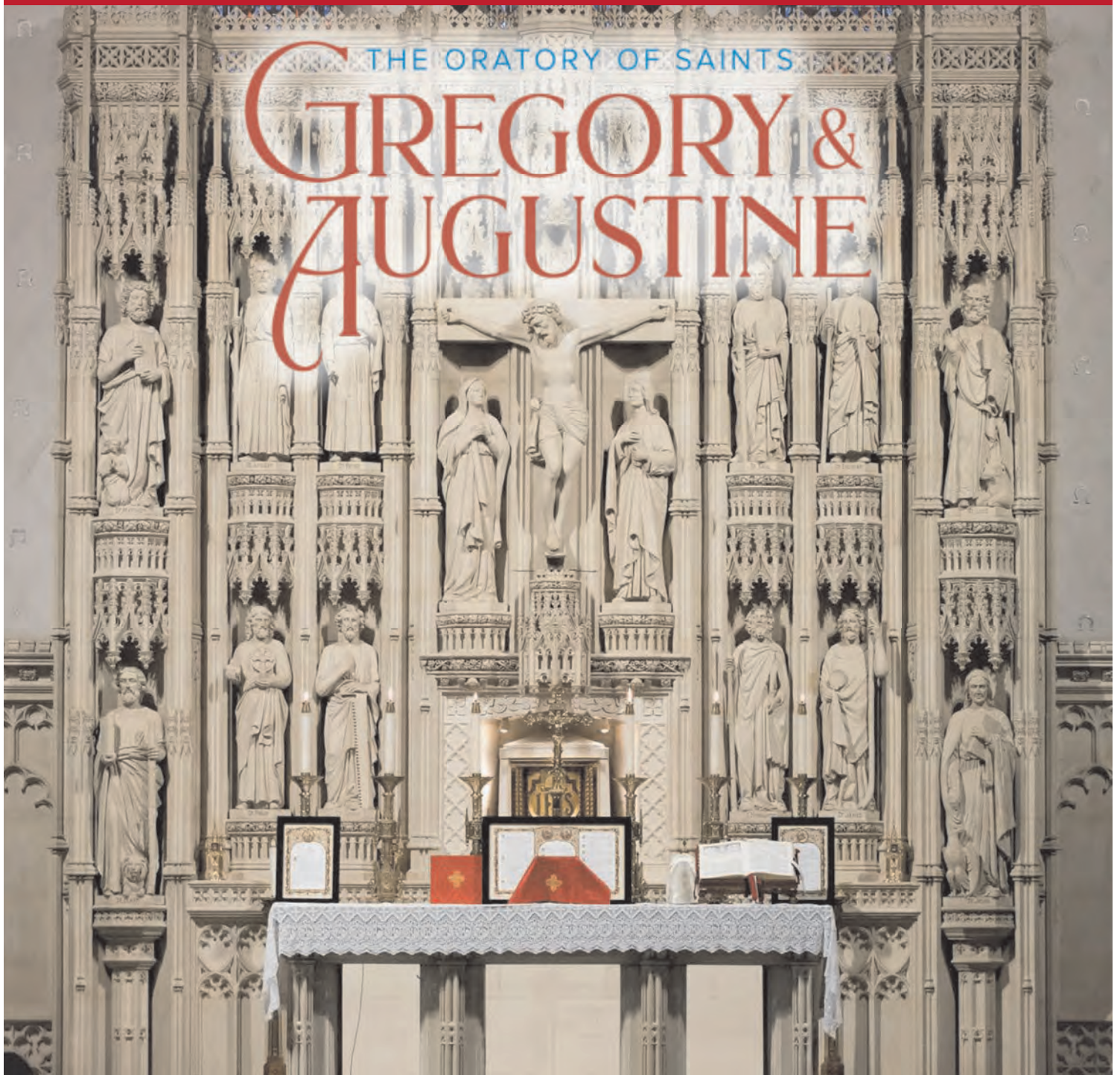

CATECHESIS ON CONFESSION

The beginning of the new calendar is an opportune time to offer a few words on the nature of our confessions. Particularly that when we present ourselves for confession, it is after a complete examination of conscience striving for a full and integral confession aware of our sins and based not on emotion only. So too, those who make frequent confession (which is encouraged) should examine their consciences for the sin of presumption.

The Catechism of the Council of Trent provides a thorough and complete explication of the Sacrament of Penance. I want to draw particular attention to the exhortation that confession should be complete and entire. The Church teaches us that we are responsible for confessing all of our mortal sins in both number (how often) and kind (nature of the sin itself). As such when we come for confession, we should not only present those sins that are on our hearts or that have easily come to mind but also confess all sins we can recall after a thorough examination of conscience.

I encourage everyone to access a thorough and complete guide for examining your conscience. This will assist you in recalling your serious sins as well as venial sins which also work against growing in holiness. A good examination of conscience will also provide the requisite detachment from the emotions that are often associated with the sins for which we are guilty. There are situations where we might feel bad about a particular interaction, situation, but no sin was involved and then there are times when we have grown so accustomed to our sins that we no longer feel guilt about them and fail to confess them. Prepare well for the sacrament so that you can also use well the graces received.

FROM THE RECTOR

One of the Church's great sources of spiritual richness is the structure of the liturgical calendar and how it assists us in not only celebrating the Paschal Mystery but forces us to penetrate more deeply into these mysteries. This dynamic is manifest in our celebration today of Passion Sunday. In the new calendar, Passion Sunday and Palm Sunday are collapsed into one reality which is an unfortunate occurrence precisely because entrance into the Lord's Passion and Death requires not only recalling His triumphal entrance into Jerusalem (Palm Sunday) but also meditating on the hardness of heart, hatred of truth and rejection of God that was swirling around Our Lord before and during His entrance into the Holy City. Passion Sunday begins the painful journey of inserting us into the events surrounding our Lord which lead to His Passion and Death. This profound meditation on these Sacred Mysteries forces us to acknowledge our own sins and their contribution to the Lord's suffering. The veiled images we encounter in Church today, which will remain hidden until the joyous proclamation of Easter, serve as liturgical reminders for us to strive to find the Lord at all times especially when He might be obscured by our doubts, fears and sins. Let us entreat the Holy Spirit to provide us with strength and courage to die with Christ in order that we might truly live with Him!

THOUGHTS ON PASSIONTIDE VEILING:

- From the Gospel of Passion Sunday (John 8 46:59): "They took up stones therefore to cast at Him: but Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple." This reminds us of the humiliation to which Our Lord subjected Himself in hiding from the Pharisees. If the Master's glory is eclipsed, it is but right that the servants (the statues of Our Lady and the Saints) also be so. Thus, they are veiled.
- Furthermore, the veiling increases the breathtaking suspense of the great mysteries by carrying on that progressive stripping that takes place in Septuagesima and Lent. In Septuagesima, flowers are no longer used. In Passiontide, the relics are taken away and the statues hidden. Finally, after the Liturgy of Holy Thursday, the altars themselves (except the altar of repose) are stripped bare to show the desolation of Good Friday.
- The crucifixes are unveiled on Good Friday beautifully highlighting the primacy of the Cross for our salvation. Good Friday is the climax, even the crown jewel of the Sacred Triduum. The rest of the statues are unveiled at the Easter Vigil during the Gloria liturgically manifesting the joy of Heaven that has been won for us only through the Cross of Christ and His Crucifixion. (Thank you to Anna Kalinowski, Auxiliatrix of the Oratory, for these reflections.)

Our Lady of Walsingham, intercede for us who have recourse to thee!
