FIRST CONFESSION

On Saturday, March 2nd, 15 young people of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory & Augustine received their First Confession. I am grateful to their teachers in preparing them well and to Jake and Terri Fowler for their leadership of our CCD Program. Please continue to pray for all our young people enrolled in the CCD program here at the Oratory especially those preparing for Confirmation and First Holy Communion.

ELECTRICAL WORK

Beginning the month of April, the Church of the Oratory will undergo a complete renovation of the electrical wiring and the refurbishing of the lights and the light fixtures as well as the addition of new lighting for the ceiling of the Church. By way of background, the wiring in the Church has been a problem since the arrival of the Oratory in 2018. There have been various attempts to respond to specific light and wiring issues, but these individual incidents have indicated serious issues with the overall wiring/electrical in the Church. The lights over the pews on both the Mary and Joseph side of the Church have not worked for a year or more and several months ago we had light failures in the vestibule. It was in response to this issue that led us to the decision to move forward with this project. This is a necessary expenditure at this time and fortunately we are in a financial situation where are able to respond immediately. What this means for all of us: there will be workers on campus; work going on in the Church at various times throughout the day; scaffolding in the Church proper will be in place for at least a month. It is my hope that this work will be completely by early June, and we will see vast improvements for our beautiful Church. As the work begins, I ask for everyone's patience and forbearance with the various inconveniences with which we will all contend. As updates are available, I will share all necessary information with the Oratory community. Finally, I ask for everyone's fervent prayers for a successful completion of the project and for the continued longevity and stability of the Oratory. As always, if there are questions and concerns, please direct them to the Rector.

In the next several months the bulletin will be undergoing some necessary changes. BACULUS CANTORALIS

The baculus cantoralis (cantor's staff) is a custom that originated in Antioch, representing the role of the *precentor* (head cantor). Spiritually, the staff commemorates the Jewish Pasch ritual, when one has to eat the meal standing up holding a staff to commemorate the Exodus. These staves are mentioned in the Ordines Romani, a series of early and medieval treatises on liturgical rubrics. Historically, the baculus cantoralis was present in centers of solemn liturgy across Christendom (East and West), in common use until the twentieth century in France, Spain, Portugal, Germany, England, Belgium, and South America (by way of the Spanish). In France, the baculus was a heraldic mark for cantors. In certain places, not only the precentor, but all the cantors had their "batons." A common application of the baculus was to have two staves, used by the leader of each side of liturgical choir, to tap the rhythm of the chant on the ground, or to point at the cantor who was to intone the next chant. There are also rubrics given for the precentor to discipline cantors who misbehave or sleep during divine services with the baculus. The schola would like to thank one of its members for constructing the wooden stand for the use of our own baculus cantoralis. In the future, the schola hopes to add a miniature carving of St. Louis IX on the top of the staff.
