PRIESTHOOD ORDINATION

At the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis on Saturday, 25 May 2024 @ 10:00 am, Rev. Mr. Joseph Martin will be ordained to the holy priesthood for the Archdiocese of Saint Louis. Joseph is in seminary at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary and a parishioner of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine. His parents, Drs. Jeff and Ann Martin, are also parishioners of the Oratory. Two other men will be ordained with Deacon Martin on that. This is a great day for the Oratory and for the Archdiocese of Saint Louis. In the short, yet powerful history of the Oratory, Joseph is our first priestly vocation. Everyone is encouraged to attend the ordination and to pray for him and the other men being ordained with him.

Fr. Martin will celebrate is First Mass of Thanksgiving here at the Oratory on Sunday, 26 May 2024 @ 1:30 pm in the afternoon. Everyone is welcome to attend the Holy Mass and then join the celebration of after the Holy Mass.

BACULUS CANTORALIS

The baculus cantoralis (cantor's staff) is a custom that originated in Antioch, representing the role of the precentor (head cantor). Spiritually, staff commemorates the Jewish Pasch ritual, when one has to eat the meal standing up holding a staff to commemorate the Exodus. These staves are mentioned in the Ordines Romani, a series of early and medieval treatises on liturgical rubrics. Historically, the baculus cantoralis was present in centers of solemn liturgy across Christendom (East and West), in common use until the twentieth century in France, Spain, Portugal, Germany, England, Belgium, and South America (by way of the Spanish). In France, the baculus was a heraldic mark for cantors. In certain places, not only the precentor, but all the cantors had their "batons." A common application of the baculus was to have two staves, used by the leader of each side of liturgical choir, to tap the rhythm of the chant on the ground, or to point at the cantor who was to intone the next chant. There are also rubrics given for the precentor to discipline cantors who misbehave or sleep during divine services with the baculus. The schola would like to thank one of its members for constructing the wooden stand for the use of our own baculus cantoralis. In the future, the schola hopes to add a

miniature carving of St. Louis IX on the top of the staff.

FROM THE WELLSPRING OF TRADITION ...

This week's installment involves some practical information regarding the reception of Holy Communion and approaching the altar rail for Holy Communion. As stated above, the electrical work has begun which will impact the seating in the body of the Church. This in turn will impact the reception of Holy Communion as there will be an imbalance of numbers on either side of the main aisle. Regarding the spiritual reality of the communion rail, Fr. Zohlsdorf explains the following:

The true Actor of the sacred action of Holy Mass is Jesus Christ the High Priest, who -through us His members, having different roles – raises words and deeds to the Father. Sometimes He acts and speaks in the person of the alter Christus the priest (Head), sometimes in the words and actions of the congregation (Body), sometimes when the priest and people act and speak together (Christus totus). Christ makes our hands and voices His own in the sacred action, but He is the actor and speaker. The church building itself ought to manifest this three-fold distinction. The sanctuary, at the head of the floor plan, is the place where Christ the Head of the Body speaks and acts, the nave is the place of the congregation, the Body. A communion rail is not only practical. It defines the holy of holies. It underscores the dignity of the liturgical actors, priest and congregation.

Some might claim that the Communion rail then becomes a barrier for the laity in the congregation to keep from away from the holy of holies. That is false. The rail helps to point out that, in the church building's layout, the congregation has its own proper character and dignity that must not be compromised or violated by "invasion", so to speak, by the priest – except in those defined moments such as the Asperges or Vidi aquam or a procession with the Blessed Sacrament.

For **practical consideration** and to facilitate a prayerful reception of Holy Communion, please keep in mind the following:

- Regardless of which line you come up in, kneel at the next available opening nearest the Saint Joseph altar.
 In other words, do not kneel in the center or the Marian side if there is space at the rail further down toward St. Joseph.
- Thus, the rail should fill from the St. Joseph side to the Marian side which, if you are facing the Tabernacle, is right to left. You should not wait to fill in the rail only on the side on which you are seated in the Church.
- Filling out the rails this way greatly helps the priest to remain prayerful as he distributes the Blessed Sacrament; he can simply go back and forth without wondering who at the rail still needs to receive, what order people are in, etc.

FROM THE RECTOR

The Church continues to exhort us to rejoice in the new life Christ has won for us. The season of Paschaltide requires these many days of prayer and reflection precisely because the august mystery of the Lord's victory over sin and death is so profound that the mind can never fully grasp what has been given to us. In our Gospel from Saint John, Our Savior tells us to ask the Father for anything and in His Divine Providence He will bestow it upon us. Great faith is required to approach the Father, but the Son's Passion, Death and Glorious Resurrection give us courage and strength. So too, Our Lord's Ascension inspires confidence in us because He has gone before us to prepare a place for us. What more could we ask of God to engender confidence in us to go to the Father in the Son through the Spirit? St. James reminds us in the Epistle that this life of faith must translate into action as well. To believe the things of God requires doing the things of God. Of course, our participation in the sacramental life of the Church is precisely that: doing that which God commands! We are also called to practice profound charity, live a confident hope, and strengthen the gift of faith already received. All of this is accomplished through daily prayer, deliberate acts of service, and hearts full of mercy and compassion. Let us continue to rejoice in the new life given to us through the Cross. Through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother, may our souls magnify the Lord through all that we do.
