FROM THE WELLSPRING OF TRADITION ... OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM GIRLS' GUILD

At our recent May crowning, you may have noticed a group of girls in white dresses taking part in the procession to the altar of Our Lady. This was the Our Lady of Walsingham Girls' Guild. Founded last September, the Guild's members (girls of the Oratory ranging in age from 5 to 18) will now become a regular part of our Oratory's processions and devotional life.

The Our Lady of Walsingham Girls' Guild exists to help form young ladies in virtue and true femininity as modeled by the Blessed Virgin Mary. Through prayer and the cultivation of various handcrafts, members of the Guild contribute to the liturgical life of the Oratory and gain a deeper appreciation of the riches of the Faith.

The Girls' Guild has regular meetings and many special events linked to the Church's various feasts. At meetings, the Guild's members receive instruction on the Faith, the liturgy, the liturgical arts, and opportunities to participate in various projects such as vestment repair and floral design. To represent themselves at processions, the Girls' Guild members carry a banner of Our Lady of Walsingham which they designed and made themselves. The banner is made of precious silk fabric and features a motif of Our Lady hand-painted by one of the Guild's own members.

The ceremonial dress of the Guild is white dresses, chapel veils, or flower crowns. Girls who have memorized a certain number of Marian hymns receive the royal sash which features a blessed Miraculous Medal. Younger girls wear a pale blue sash to represent Our Lady's joys; older members wear a dark blue sash to represent Our Lady's sorrows; and any Guild member who works diligently to memorize the entire Guild hymnal and all of the seasonal Marian antiphons, receives the gold sash which represents Our Lady's Heavenly glory.

We extend a hearty welcome to the Our Lady of Walsingham Girls' Guild. There are many opportunities for feminine enrichment in the liturgical life, and the Guild helps to present these to its members while drawing them closer to Christ through Our Lady. May she bless them now and always.

FROM THE RECTOR

The beauty of the mysteries of Christ and their lived expression in the life of Holy Mother the Church is that we are never able to exhaust them. We are able to contemplate, for lifetimes, the blessing given to us through the redemptive work of Christ and in all those lifetimes we would never exhaust the well-spring of mercy, love, and holiness into which we have been invited by Christ. Today's celebration of the Most Holy Trinity places before us the central, foundational mystery of our Catholic lives: the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost from whom all goodness comes and this same Trinity of persons to whom we all desire to return. In Her wisdom and love, our Mother the Church provokes our hearts and minds to a contemplation of the Trinity immediately after celebrating the descent of the Holy Ghost on Pentecost. Abbot Rupert, writing in the twelfth century, beautiful expresses this wonderful relationship: "As soon as we have celebrated the coming of the Holy Ghost, we hail in song the feast of the Holy Trinity, the following Sunday, a well-chosen place in the calendar, for immediately after the descent of the Holy Spirit, preaching and conversion began and faith through baptism and confession in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost." How blessed to have revealed to us this perfect communion of persons. Let us also be mindful of the great responsibility bestowed upon us at our own baptism into this blessed communion to go and preach, teach, and baptize in their name. Take time this week to revisit the Sacred Scripture from today's Holy Mass and strive to enter more deeply into this great and august Mystery!
