ELECTRIC UPDATE

The work continues on the electrical project in the Church. We are making progress and it is hoped that work will be completed by the end of July. As with all projects, issues arise that were not in the original plans and those are being addressed. We have refurbished and cleaned the sconces on the side aisles and the lamps in the vestibule. The new lighting which shines on the ceiling has also been installed. With just these adjustments, there is greater light in the Church. The newly installed lightening revealed the need to clean the beams, which is in progress. It is also revealed a large spot on the arch leading into the sanctuary. There will be an attempt to repair it, but we might need to postpone this project because of tuck-pointing that needs to be done to the Church and rectory. Thank you to everyone for their patience, especially with the scaffolding. Please continue to pray for the success of this project and the future projects the Oratory will need to undertake in order to care for our beautiful Church.

PRO-LIFE UPDATES:

Missouri Right to Life: Update on Pro-Abortion Initiative – Signatures to put a right to unlimited abortion in our State Constitution were turned into the Secretary of State on May 3rd. While they gathered more than twice what was required in raw numbers, they were also required to get specific amounts in each Congressional District based on the votes in the last gubernatorial election. They were also required to gain legible signatures from only Missouri registered voters and only from the county of the petition they were signing. We are awaiting validation of those signatures from the Secretary of State at this time. Please offer prayers and fasting that there

aren't enough signatures to put this on the November 2024 ballot.

In the year 1673, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation sister in religious life who had an intimate relationship with Christ, reported a vision in which Our Lord allowed her to rest her head against his chest. When Christ revealed his Sacred Heart to her, he said, "Behold this Heart which has so loved men that it spared nothing, even going so far as to exhaust and consume itself, to prove to them its love." She was from that moment dedicated to promoting devotion to the Sacred Heart.

She further records Our Lord's words, writing, "On Friday during Holy Communion, [Our Lord] said these words to [me]...I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that its all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on nine first Fridays of consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they will not die under my displeasure or without receiving their sacraments, my divine Heart making itself their assured refuge at the last moment."

What a beautiful promise! Some of us, I am sure, are at least a little bit worried about dying in a state of grace. We worry we won't be prepared. This is a valid concern, but don't be overly anxious! Jesus has promised to supply all the grace we need in our final moments. It is our responsibility, though, to prepare ahead of time. We must live every

moment as though it may be our last and never take Our Lord's Sacred Heart for granted.

Some worry that they will not make it to confession in time to be forgiven of a lingering mortal sin, and I would encourage everyone to make frequent use of the confessional. We have confession times every single day here at the oratory. Don't wait or put it off. But be assured, if we live our lives as Jesus wishes us to, he will bring us safely to Heaven and mortal sin will not win the day. Open your heart to Christ and he will give you his Sacred Heart as a resting place.

I want to go over the words of Our Lord to St. Margaret again, just so we understand the details. It's nice to have a simple, clear plan to follow. Our Lord says that we may obtain extra graces by 1) receiving Holy Communion on the 1st Friday on 9 consecutive Fridays, and 2) making these communions with an internal devotion to the Sacred Heart, particular to make reparations for sins.

So great was the love of St. Margaret Mary for the Sacred Heart that the last words on her lips at the time of her death were, "What have I

in heaven and what do I desire on earth, but Thee alone, O my God."

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Our Lord, so what better time to begin practicing the First Friday devotion than right now?




