ANNOUNCEMENTS

Fr. Linus Dolce, OSB, former pastor of St. Barnabas and monk of St. Louis Abbey is going to be assisting the Oratory on Mondays, Fridays and Sundays. I am grateful to Fr. Linus for his generosity and to Abbot Gregory for consenting to Fr. Linus' contribution to the Oratory. With the presence of Fr. Linus, there will be a change to the daily Holy Mass schedule. Beginning on Monday, 19 August 2024, Holy Masses will be celebrated daily (Monday through Friday) at 6:30 am and at 12:15 pm. Confessions will remain at 11 am. This change means that the Tuesday and Thursday 7:00 am Holy Mass along with the Wednesday evening at 6:30 pm Holy Mass will **NO** longer be celebrated. On Wednesdays, we will continue to have Holy Hour at 5:00 pm with Confessions, and Benediction at 6:15 pm. It is anticipated that the early weekday Holy Mass will better accommodate the schedules of those going into work and more of the faithful will be able to participate in daily Holy Mass. So too, the new schedule will provide greater consistency to the schedule. Change is never easy, and I appreciate that not everyone will welcome these changes. Please be patient, communicate any concerns to me, and most importantly continue to pray for the health and well-being of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine.

SUMMER SCHEDULE

The summer schedule runs 1 July 2024 and goes until 14 August 2024 inclusive. The Oratory will have only one daily Holy Mass at 12:15 pm with Confessions at 11:00 am. **The Saturday and Sunday schedules (both Masses & Confession times) will remain the same.** The offices hours during this time will be Monday through Thursday from 8:00 am until 2:30 pm. **The offices will be closed on Fridays. There will be no one to answer the phone or answer the rectory door on Fridays. Please plan your needs accordingly.** Please conduct all business, Monday through Thursday.

WEEKLY COLLECTION/TITHING

Asking for money is never easy; I am grateful that the generosity of the faithful of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine, have made it possible for me to limit asking for money. However, as the new budget is submitted to the Archdiocese, it is time again to encourage your continued to support; to ask that everyone prayerfully consider increasing their donation; to ask those who either never give or give little, to consider increasing their donation. I want to specifically encourage those who have not given to share the responsibility of caring for the Oratory along with the other generous members of the community. While the giving of the faithful of the Oratory generally surpasses that of other parish entities, there are still a significant number of registered parishioners who fail to contribute each fiscal year. I realize that the financial situations of each person are unique, and some may not be in a position to give, but I would still ask everyone to contribute something. As I often say when raising money for Covenant Network-Catholic Radio, no amount is too small!

Each year, the needed weekly collection number has increased, and this fiscal year is no different. Beginning 7 July 2024, the targeted weekly collection amount is \$17, 869. The increase reflects the continued growth of the Oratory, more personnel for our liturgical celebrations and

the on-going maintenance and improvement of the physical plant itself. Regarding the maintenance and improvement of the physical plant, part of the work on the electric system is included in this new budget. It is also anticipated that there will be some work done on the parking area near the garage. There is still work to be accomplished on the outside of the Church and Rectory as well as work to be accomplished on the whole parking lot.

I would ask everyone for their continued generosity as we continue to grow. Our fiscal responsibility indicates to the Archdiocese our ability to sustain ourselves and contributes to our longevity and stability. In advance, thank you so much and may God reward your generosity.

PRO-LIFE UPDATES:

Missouri Right to Life: Update on Pro-Abortion Initiative – Signatures to put a right to unlimited abortion in our State Constitution were turned into the Secretary of State on May 3rd. While they gathered more than twice what was required in raw numbers, they were also required to get specific amounts in each Congressional District based on the votes in the last gubernatorial election. They were also required to gain legible signatures from only Missouri registered voters and only from the county of the petition they were signing. We are awaiting validation of those signatures from the Secretary of State at this time. Please offer prayers and fasting that there aren’t enough signatures to put this on the November 2024 ballot.

FROM THE WELLSPRING OF TRADITION ... ON PRAYING THE PSALMS IN MASS AND DIVINE OFFICE

You may be keenly aware already that the prayers of Holy Mass are saturated with the Psalms, and that the Mass propers are frequently quotes from the Psalms. If you have prayed any of the divine office, you have no doubt noticed that the heart of the office is praying the Psalms. In the older form of the office, the psalms are prayed through in their entirety in a single week.

You have also, no doubt, noticed that some of the Psalms make for difficult prayer. While some are celebratory and thankful, others are despondent or even angry. Because of this, some people have the mistaken idea that the Psalms are not all fruitful for meditation, or that some parts of the Psalms are no longer fitting with a Catholic outlook on prayer and morality. I wouldn't blame anyone for being hesitant to pray the "difficult" Psalms, after all it can be a struggle to see how it's spiritually beneficial to do so. But the Church, in her wisdom, has from time immemorial held onto these prayers and used them in her liturgy. She recognizes, 1) that the Word of God is not ours to edit, and 2) that if we do not pray the difficult parts of the scriptures, then we are deprived (as Dr. Peter Kwasniewski says) of the "opportunity to wrestle with the Word of God, like Jacob with the angel."

In learning how and why we pray the full range of the Psalms, there is no better teacher than St. Ambrose. This is what he says:

"In the book of Psalms there is profit for all, with healing power for our salvation. There is instruction from history, teaching from the law, prediction from prophecy, chastisement from denunciation, persuasion from oral preaching. All who read it may find the cure for their own individual failings. All with eyes to see can discover in it a complete gymnasium for the soul, a stadium for all the virtues, equipped for every kind of exercise; it is for each to choose the kind he judges best to help him gain the prize..."

A Psalm is a blessing on the lips of the people a hymn in praise of God... It is a source of security at night, a lesson in wisdom by day. It is a shield when we are afraid, a celebration of holiness, a vision of serenity, a promise of peace and harmony. a confession of faith in song. It soothes the temper, distracts from care, lightens the burden of sorrow.

In a psalm instruction vies with beauty...what experience is not covered by a reading of the psalms?"

St. Ambrose goes on to make the most important point of all, one which applies to the whole of the Old Testament, which is that the Old Testament, in its entirety, speaks of Christ. He writes:

"What I am to say of the grace of prophecy? We see that what others hinted at in riddles was promised openly and clearly to the psalmist alone: the Lord Jesus was to be born of his seed, according to the word of the Lord, I will place upon your throne one who is the fruit of your flesh.

In the Psalms, then, not only is Jesus born for us, he also undergoes his saving passion in his body, he lies in death, he rises again, he ascends into heaven, he sits at the right and of the Father."


