NEW HOLY MASS SCHEDULE

Beginning on Monday, 19 August 2024, Holy Masses will be celebrated daily (Monday through Friday) at 6:30 am and at 12:15 pm. Confessions will remain at 11 am. This change means that the Tuesday and Thursday 7:00 am Holy Mass along with the Wednesday evening at 6:30 pm Holy Mass will **NO** longer be celebrated. On Wednesdays, we will continue to have Holy Hour at 5:00 pm with Confessions, and Benediction at 6:15 pm. It is anticipated that the early weekday Holy Mass will better accommodate the schedules of those going into work and more of the faithful will be able to participate in daily Holy Mass. So too, the new schedule will provide greater consistency to the schedule. Change is never easy and I appreciate that not everyone will welcome these changes. Please be patient, communicate any concerns to me, and most importantly continue to pray for the health and well-being of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine.

WEEKLY COLLECTION/TITHING

Asking for money is never easy; I am grateful that the generosity of the faithful of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine, have made it possible for me to limit asking for money. However, as the new budget is submitted to the Archdiocese, it is time again to encourage your continued to support; to ask that everyone prayerfully consider increasing their donation; to ask those who either never give or give little, to consider increasing their donation. I want to specifically encourage those who have not given to share the responsibility of caring for the Oratory along with the other generous members of the community. While the giving of the faithful of the Oratory generally surpasses that of other parish entities, there are still a significant number of registered parishioners who fail to contribute each fiscal year. I realize that the financial situations of each person are unique, and some may not be in a position to give, but I would still ask everyone to contribute something. As I often say when raising money for Covenant Network-Catholic Radio, no amount is too small!

Each year, the needed weekly collection number has increased, and this fiscal year is no different. Beginning 7 July 2024, the targeted weekly collection amount is \$17, 869. The increase reflects the continued growth of the Oratory, more personnel for our liturgical celebrations and the on-going maintenance and improvement of the physical plant itself. Regarding the maintenance and improvement of the physical plant, part of the work on the electric system is included in this new budget. It is also anticipated that there will be some work done on the parking area near the garage. There is still work to be accomplished on the outside of the Church and Rectory as well as work to be accomplished on the whole parking lot.

PRO-LIFE UPDATES:

Missouri Right to Life: Update on Pro-Abortion Initiative – Signatures to put a right to unlimited abortion in our State Constitution were turned into the Secretary of State on May 3rd. While they gathered more than twice what was required in raw numbers, they were also required to get specific amounts in each Congressional District based on the votes in the last gubernatorial election. They were also required to gain legible signatures from only Missouri registered voters and only from the county of the petition they were signing. We are awaiting validation of those signatures from the Secretary of State at this time. Please offer prayers and fasting that there aren't enough signatures to put this on the November 2024 ballot.

FROM THE WELLSPRING OF TRADITION... ABOUT THE SIGN OF PEACE

The Pax, or kiss of peace, is an ancient rite. It’s so old, points out theologian Joseph Shaw, that the Irish word for “kiss,” póg, actually derives from the Latin “pax” thanks to this ceremony. In the Roman Rite, the sign of peace historically has been a bit confusing because it has moved between two different places during Holy Mass. In France, it used to take place before the Offertory. In Africa and Rome, it took place before Holy Communion and after the *Pater Noster*. The Church’s current rite follows the practice of Rome, partly because this symbolic placement has a great effect on the meaning of that part of the Mass.

Pope Innocent III teaches that the Pax is a “seal” of what has gone before, reminding us of what we have just prayed in the Pater Noster; “And forgive us our debts, as we also forgive our debtors.” In some way, our peace is directly related to our willingness to forgive those who have harmed us. When we receive the sign of peace, we must also give it.

In addition, with the consecrated Host present upon the altar during the Pax ceremony, it gains another kind of theological significance. Before starting the exchange with the deacon, the priest kisses the altar next to the consecrated Host. The Pax, then, is the peace of Christ really and truly present in the consecrated Host and the peace arises not from our own feelings or efforts but, rather, directly from the altar and the sacrifice of Our Lord.

The position of the Pax after the fraction of the Host and before its subsequent mingling into the chalice reinforces this understanding that the peace of Christ is a direct result of his death for our sins. In the scriptures, it is the Risen Lord who offers the peace to his disciples in the Upper Room. It is only after his death (represented by the fraction) that the peace of the resurrection (the mingling of the host and precious blood) is achieved.

Looked at in this context, the Pax is not so much an opportunity to make friends, shake hands, or chat as it is a sacred ritual blessing. As a blessing, it matters less if the faithful take part directly or physically in the ceremony because the blessing is passed on in the typical manner of all blessings, which is to say, from the altar. From Christ to his people. This peace is hard-won but it is very much for you.


