WEEKLY COLLECTION/TITHING

Asking for money is never easy; I am grateful that the generosity of the faithful of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine, have made it possible for me to limit asking for money. However, as the new budget is submitted to the Archdiocese, it is time again to encourage your continued to support; to ask that everyone prayerfully consider increasing their donation; to ask those who either never give or give little, to consider increasing their donation. I want to specifically encourage those who have not given to share the responsibility of caring for the Oratory along with the other generous members of the community. While the giving of the faithful of the Oratory generally surpasses that of other parish entities, there are still a significant number of registered parishioners who fail to contribute each fiscal year. I realize that the financial situations of each person are unique, and some may not be in a position to give, but I would still ask everyone to contribute something. As I often say when raising money for Covenant Network-Catholic Radio, no amount is too small!

Each year, the needed weekly collection number has increased, and this fiscal year is no different. Beginning 7 July 2024, the targeted weekly collection amount is \$17, 869. The increase reflects the continued growth of the Oratory, more personnel for our liturgical celebrations and the on-going maintenance and improvement of the physical plant itself. Regarding the maintenance and improvement of the physical plant, part of the work on the electric system is included in this new budget. It is also anticipated that there will be some work done on the parking area near the garage. There is still work to be accomplished on the outside of the Church and Rectory as well as work to be accomplished on the whole parking lot.

I would ask everyone for their continued generosity as we continue to grow. Our fiscal responsibility indicates to the Archdiocese our ability to sustain ourselves and contributes to our longevity and stability. In advance, thank you so much and may God reward your generosity.

ELECTRIC UPDATE

The work in the Church is now complete. There continue to be a few areas of concern that are being addressed over the next several weeks. I appreciate everyone's patience during this process which has resulted in better lighting for our beautiful Church.

PARKING ON CAMPUS

The Oratory has the happy problem of more faithful than available parking spaces. It is appreciated that for the 8:00 am and 10:00 am Holy Masses finding a spot can be difficult. Please, however, only park in designated areas. Regarding the middle parking lot between the Church and the school building: Park only in those spots that have a parking curb in front of them. **DO NOT** park in front of the garage, **DO NOT** park in the spots on the lot east of the garage which are all reserved spots. **DO NOT** park near the trashcans. Everyone's attention to this is greatly appreciated.

PRO-LIFE UPDATES:

Missouri Right to Life: Update on Pro-Abortion Initiative – Signatures to put a right to unlimited abortion in our State Constitution were turned into the Secretary of State on May 3rd. While they gathered more than twice what was required in raw numbers, they were also required to get specific amounts in each Congressional District based on the votes in the last gubernatorial election. They were also required to gain legible signatures from only Missouri registered voters and only from the county of the petition they were signing. We are awaiting validation of those signatures from the Secretary of State at this time. Please offer prayers and fasting that there aren't enough signatures to put this on the November 2024 ballot.

FROM THE WELLSPRING OF TRADITION: SPECIAL TEXTS for the FEAST of SAINT LOUIS

The texts and chants of the liturgies for August 24 and 25 are taken from Latin manuscript BNF No. 911 in the French National Library. The manuscript was probably commissioned by Saint Louis's grandson, Philip IV ('the Fair'), and compiled by a well-known liturgist, Pierre de la Croix, shortly after Louis's canonization in Orvietto on 11 August 1297 by Boniface VIII. We celebrate liturgies on August 24 and 25 from this special manuscript as another way to allow Catholic culture to flower again and allow our heritage to shine in an ever ancient, ever new way. One of the joys of being in the Archdiocese of Saint Louis is that our French, Spanish, and German heritage mean that we can freely draw on many venerable traditions. Another reason for using this special office is that it highlights more particular events from Saint Louis's life than the common Mass for confessors. In this instance, these texts highlight specific elements of Saint Louis's character: his devotion to justice for all in the royal courts, his wise use of earthly power to direct his subjects to heaven as their goal, his devotion to helping the poor, his sacrifice of his own comfort in defense of the Holy Land, his notion of kingship as service, and his extraordinary humility. He is seen as a new David in kingly service to God's people, a new Solomon in his wise judgements, a new Ezechiel in his zeal for truth, a new Josiah in his devotion to the Law. And that he found favor in God's sight is clearly evidenced by the many miracles that occurred after his death. You can see these attributes portrayed in the splendid mosaics that outline his life in the vestibule of our own Cathedral Basilica.

Please note: this liturgical 'restoration' includes both Holy Mass and the Divine Office. That is extremely important, because it reflects the essential integrity of the Roman rite, something all but lost over the course of the 20th century. Few Catholics today have a grasp of the intrinsic unity of Mass and Divine Office. Psalmody and sacrifice have an unbreakable bond since the days of the Second Temple, on which all Catholic liturgy is based. Since Vatican II, despite the Council Fathers' strongly worded resolution to restore the Divine Office to the prominent position it held prior to its steep decline over the course of the 20th century, few Catholics know any form of liturgy apart from the Mass. The reality that the Church even has liturgical forms other than the Mass is completely foreign. And that is a tragedy, because it is simply not possible to have a comprehensive understanding of the Mass without the context of the Divine Office. A goal of restoring what was once common practice in parishes is why the Oratory of Saints Gregory and Augustine strives to make regularly scheduled public celebrations of the Divine Office available to all. We are very blessed to do this and are working to be able to fund an expansion of that offering in future years.

Reviving these older formularies for celebration is a complex business that requires a lot of work behind the scenes. Manuscripts have to be identified and researched, then transcribed, translated, and put into context. Texts and chants were often spread out over different manuscripts to accommodate the needs of different roles in choir, so multiple manuscripts are involved. We are very grateful to all of the talented scholars that have assisted in making these liturgical treasures available to us, in honor of Saint Louis and our Heavenly Father. Laus Deo semper!

FROM THE RECTOR

The celebration today of our patron, Saint Louis, King of France vividly reminds us of the desperate need for Christian leadership. The current political climate is marred by division, violence, and the naked pursuit of power. Regardless of the party to which one belongs, leadership is sorely lacking that is rooted in truth, goodness, and sacrificial service. Since his reign, Saint Louis has been a model for Catholic leadership, executing his office in the manner of our Lord who came to serve and not to be served. Saint Louis was acutely aware that the foundation of his powers came not from him or the people, but from God alone. For his part, the life of Saint Louis was one of service and sacrifice in the name of our Savior. It is almost impossible to imagine that the current cultural ethos is capable of fostering Christian leadership. This becomes even more apparent when an assessment is made of the leadership of the Church Herself. The framework of so many of those charged with governance is not the tenants of the true faith, but the expedient use of power. Saint Louis remains a profound example of authentic governance. Let us pray, through his intercession, that all leaders – religious and secular – may rely only upon the wisdom of God in their service of their neighbor and fellowman.


