VOCATIONS

In the six years the Oratory has been here at the Church of St. Luke the Evangelist, we have been blessed in so many ways: continued growth in our Oratory numbers; financial generosity; greater ownership and involvement from the Oratory community. All of these blessings have happened while we have experienced various hardships.

One of the hidden blessings has been the generosity of our young people in responding to the call of a religious vocation. Two years ago, Br. Peter Mary of the Cross (Colton Marks) departed the Oratory to begin his new life as a Discalced Hermit of Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Fairfield, Pennsylvania. He was followed by Br. Matthew of Jesus and Mary (Kevin Murphy). This past Christmas, Br. Macarius of Jesus Christ Crucified (Donald Mueller) joined them at this Carmelite monastery which continues to experience vibrant growth. In addition to these three young men, this past week, Cameron Toal departed the Oratory to begin his formation with the Institute of Christ the King, Sovereign Priest.

In recent months the Oratory has also been blessed with two young women entering consecrated religious life. This past August of 2024, Mary Hampton Hayden entered the Carmelites in Fairfield, Pennsylvania and just this month, Erin Losin entered the Filiae Laboris Mariae Sisters in Fort Scott, Kansas.

In just six years, the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine has fostered six vocations and there are many more who have expressed a desire to follow them. Sadly, there are some parishes in the Archdiocese of St. Louis that have never produced a vocation. We are blessed to have these signs of hope in our midst and should be encouraged to upon this great path of Traditional continue Catholicism. Please pray for the grace of perseverance for our young people already committed to formation. Pray for those who are discerning now their call from the Lord. Parents are exhorted to patience, trust, and confidence in the Lord if their son or daughter expresses an interest in the priesthood or consecrated religious life. And for all of us, let us always strive to keep our eyes on the blessings bestowed upon us; to thank the Lord for those blessings; and radiate joy and hope in this world that desperately needs both.

WEEKLY COLLECTION/TITHING

Asking for money is never easy; I am grateful that the generosity of the faithful of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine, have made it possible for me to limit asking for money. However, as the new budget is submitted to the Archdiocese, it is time again to encourage your continued to support; to ask that everyone prayerfully consider increasing their donation: to ask those who either never give or give little, to consider increasing their donation. I want to specifically encourage those who have not given to share the responsibility of caring for the Oratory along with the other generous members of the community. While the giving of the faithful of the Oratory generally surpasses that of other parish entities, there are still a significant number of registered parishioners who fail to contribute each fiscal year. I realize that the financial situations of each person are unique, and some may not be in a position to give, but I would still ask everyone to contribute something. As I often say when raising money for Covenant Network-Catholic Radio, no amount is too small!

Each year, the needed weekly collection number has increased, and this fiscal year is no different. Beginning 7 July 2024, the targeted weekly collection amount is \$17, 869. The increase reflects the continued growth of the Oratory, more personnel for our liturgical celebrations and the on-going maintenance and improvement of the physical plant itself. Regarding the maintenance and improvement of the physical plant, part of the work on the electric system is included in this new budget. It is also anticipated that there will be some work done on the parking area near the garage. There is still work to be accomplished on the outside of the Church and Rectory as well as work to be accomplished on the whole parking lot.

I would ask everyone for their continued generosity as we continue to grow. Our fiscal responsibility indicates to the Archdiocese our ability to sustain ourselves and contributes to our longevity and stability. In advance, thank you so much and may God reward your generosity.

FROM THE WELLSPRING OF TRADITION: Devotion to Our Lady of Walsingham

Opposite the altar of Our Lady here at the Oratory, we have a shrine dedicated to Our Lady of Walsingham. The wooden statue represents Our Lady enthroned as Queen wearing a golden Saxon crown and golden slippers; she holds the Child Jesus Who holds a Gospel book.

Many are unfamiliar with this beautiful apparition of Our Lady and the history of her remarkable image. The short history below comes from an article by Mr. John Paul Sonnen of the *Liturgical Arts Journal*.

The history of the shrine [in Walsingham, England] dates back to the eleventh century - nearly one-thousand years ago - when an English noblewoman by the name of Richeldis de Faverches is said to have experienced heavenly apparitions of the Blessed Mother. That was in the year 1061. The event is recorded as one of the earliest Marian apparitions and certainly the most cherished in English history.

According to legend, Lady Richeldis wished to do something special in order to give honor to the Blessed Mother. She had a series of three visions in which Our Lady fetched her soul from England and brought her to Nazareth during a religious ecstasy. There she saw the house of the Annunciation, a brick structure built into a cave. Our Lady is said to have requested of Lady Richeldis that she build a replica of the house in her native village of Walsingham, a place where people could come and pay homage to her, the Mother of Jesus. Mary is said to have promised, "Whoever seeks my help there will not go away empty-handed." The chapel that was constructed came to be known as the "holy house" and became a shrine and focus of pilgrimage until its destruction by Henry VIII.

While for most people the Holy Land was too distant to visit, Walsingham became a more convenient place of pilgrimage, ranking alongside Jerusalem, Rome, and Santiago de Compostella. The shrine was visited by many important personages, including Erasmus in 1512. Even King Henry VIII himself had come here on pilgrimage, proof of the devotion of the British Sovereigns, paying allegiance to Our Lady with great fervor.


Over the years, Walsingham became famous with wealth and prestige. Lavish gifts were left by many who came to visit. Therefore, its fall under Henry VIII was symbolic. On the eve of the Reformation in 1513 when Erasmus visited, he wrote: "When you look in you would say it is the abode of saints, so brilliantly does it shine with gems, gold and silver...Our Lady stands in the dark at the right side of the altar...a little image, remarkable neither for its size, material or workmanship."

In 1538, with the Protestant rebellion in full swing, Henry VIII allowed the priory, monastery, and shrine to be looted and destroyed. He ordered the sacred statue of Our Lady of Walsingham to be burnt at Chelsea.

The only image that survived of the original statue was a representation seen in the seal/stamp of the pre-Reformation medieval priory. Over the past 100 years, interest in the pre-Reformation shrine, its lost statue, and pilgrimage has grown. In 1921 the local Anglican vicar had the idea to recreate the famous statue based on the image depicted in the seal. In 1922 a new statue was set up in the local Anglican church. Regular pilgrim devotion followed among both Anglicans and Catholics. During World War II, Walsingham was a restricted zone closed to visitors. In May 1945, American forces organized the first Mass in the old priory grounds since the Reformation. After the war, the Catholics, too, recreated their own statue of Our Lady of Walsingham.

Our statue here at the Oratory was selected by then-rector Father Bede Price and has traveled with our community over the years of our growth. It was hand-carved in Italy and blessed by His Eminence, Cardinal Burke.


