CHRIST THE KING

The celebration of Christ the King is Sunday, 27 October. We will honor Our Lord and King with a Eucharistic Procession, Adoration, and Benediction. The procession begins at the completion of the 10:00 am Holy Mass and upon our return to Church there will be a time for Adoration and conclude with Benediction. The afternoon will conclude with Vespers at 2:30 pm. If you have already come to an earlier Mass, please plan to return for the Procession, Adoration, and Vespers. May Christ the King always reign in our hearts. Also, after all Masses, the community will renew its consecration to the Sacred Heart

Those young people recently confirmed and those who made their First Holy Communion are invited to dress in their communion clothes and participate in the procession.

ALL SAINTS DAY

For the celebration of the Solemnity of All Saints (Friday, 1 November 2024), the Oratory will have its normal schedule of Holy Masses and Confession for First Friday: Holy Mass (Low) @ 6:30 am; Confessions @ 11 am, Holy Mass (High) @ 12:15 pm; Confessions @ 5:00 pm, Holy Mass (High) @ 6:30 pm.

ALL SOULS DAY

For the Commemoration of All Souls (Saturday, 2 November 2024) the Oratory will celebrate three Holy Masses that day: the normal 8:15 am Mass with confessions at 7:00 am; Holy Mass will also be celebrated at 10:00 am and 12 Noon. Both of these Masses will be High Masses. All are encouraged to attend and to pray for All the Faithful Departed.

VOCATIONS

In the six years the Oratory has been here at the Church of St. Luke the Evangelist, we have been blessed in so many ways: continued growth in our Oratory numbers; financial generosity; greater ownership and involvement from the Oratory community. All of these blessings have happened while we have experienced various hardships.

One of the hidden blessings has been the generosity of our young people in responding to the call of a religious vocation. Two years ago, Br. Peter Mary of the Cross (Colton Marks) departed the Oratory to begin his new life as a Discalced Hermit of Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Fairfield, Pennsylvania. He was followed by Br. Matthew of Jesus and Mary (Kevin Murphy). This past Christmas, Br. Macarius of Jesus Christ Crucified (Donald Mueller) joined them at this Carmelite monastery which continues to experience vibrant growth. In addition to these three young men, this past week, Cameron Toal departed the Oratory to begin his formation with the Institute of Christ the King, Sovereign Priest

In recent months the Oratory has also been blessed with two young women entering consecrated religious life. This past August of 2024, Mary Hampton Hayden entered the Carmelites in Fairfield, Pennsylvania and just this month, Erin Losin entered the Filiae Laboris Mariae Sisters in Fort Scott, Kansas.

In just six years, the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine has fostered six vocations and there are many more who have expressed a desire to follow them. Sadly, there are some parishes in the Archdiocese of St. Louis that have never produced a vocation. We are blessed to have these signs of hope in our midst and should be encouraged to continue upon this great path of Traditional Catholicism. Please pray for the grace of perseverance for our young people already committed to formation. Pray for those who are discerning now their call from the Lord. Parents are exhorted to patience, trust, and confidence in the Lord if their son or daughter expresses an interest in the priesthood or consecrated religious life. And for all of us, let us always strive to keep our eyes on the blessings bestowed upon us; to thank the Lord for those blessings; and radiate joy and hope in this world that desperately needs both.

LATIN COURSE

WEEKLY COLLECTION/TITHING

Asking for money is never easy; I am grateful that the generosity of the faithful of the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine, have made it possible for me to limit asking for money. However, as the new budget is submitted to the Archdiocese, it is time again to encourage your continued to support; to ask that everyone prayerfully consider increasing their donation; to ask those who either never give or give little, to consider increasing their donation. I want to specifically encourage those who have not given to share the responsibility of caring for the Oratory along with the other generous members of the community. While the giving of the faithful of the Oratory generally surpasses that of other parish entities, there are still a significant number of registered parishioners who fail to contribute each fiscal year. I realize that the financial situations of each person are unique, and some may not be in a position to give, but I would still ask everyone to contribute something. As I often say when raising money for Covenant Network-Catholic Radio, no amount is too small!

Each year, the needed weekly collection number has increased, and this fiscal year is no different. Beginning 7 July 2024, the targeted weekly collection amount is \$17, 869. The increase reflects the continued growth of the Oratory, more personnel for our liturgical celebrations and the on-going maintenance and improvement of the physical plant itself. Regarding the maintenance and improvement of the physical plant, part of the work on the electric system is included in this new budget. It is also anticipated that there will be some work done on the parking area near the garage. There is still work to be accomplished on the outside of the Church and Rectory as well as work to be accomplished on the whole parking lot.

I would ask everyone for their continued generosity as we continue to grow. Our fiscal responsibility indicates to the Archdiocese our ability to sustain ourselves and contributes to our longevity and stability. In advance, thank you so much and may God reward your generosity.

PARKING ON CAMPUS

The Oratory has the happy problem of more faithful than available parking spaces. It is appreciated that for the 8:00 am and 10:00 am Holy Masses finding a spot can be difficult. Please, however, only park in designated areas. Regarding the middle parking lot between the Church and the school building: Park only in those spots that have a parking curb in front of them. **DO NOT** park next to the garage, **DO NOT** park in the spots on the lot east of the garage which are all reserved spots. **DO NOT** park near the trashcans. Your attention to this is appreciated.

FROM THE WELLSPRING OF TRADITION: Devotion to Our Lady of Walsingham

To help the Oratory faithful grow in devotion to St. Gregory, St. Augustine, and Our Lady of Walsingham, the patrons of our oratory, Msgr. Morris has ordered holy cards in their honor. The third card in this series honors Our Lady of Walsingham and will be distributed to the Oratory faithful by members of the Girls Guild following the 10 am Mass on Sunday, 13 October. Cards will also be left in the vestibules in the coming weeks.

Below is a reflection on our Oratory patrons:

St. Gregory the Great reigned as Supreme Pontiff from 590 to 604 A.D. Among the innumerable multitude of his good works was his zealous promotion of the Faith in then-heathen England. To this end, he sent St. Augustine and forty monks to spread the Faith in the remote isle. As the first Archbishop of Canterbury, Augustine, with his monks, baptized more than ten thousand persons on Christmas Day, 597 A.D. On hearing the news, St. Gregory sent a letter expressing his joy.

After such a magnificent beginning, the following centuries yielded still more fruits of conversion from England's rich soil. One of the earliest apparitions of Our Lady recorded anywhere in the world took place in the town of Walsingham in 1061 A.D. There, Our Lady appeared to a noble woman asking that a shrine be constructed with a replica of her house at Nazareth. After the miraculous completion of the shrine, pilgrims from all over Europe flocked to honor Our Lady. As a pilgrimage destination, Walsingham was second in popularity only to the Holy Land itself. Strange as it may sound to us today in the wake of the Protestant Revolt, England during the Medieval period was called "Our Lady's Dowry," so rich was devotion to her there.

Although we members of the Oratory are Americans with various national identities, there are many reasons that Our Lady of Walsingham is an excellent patroness for us too. Firstly, the Oratory's beginnings at the St. Louis Priory, a monastery founded by English Benedictines impel a special allegiance to the Patroness of England. Secondly, Our Lady of Walsingham as a gracious and powerful mother of pilgrims must smile kindly on all of the Oratory faithful who have discovered the beauty of the ancient liturgies and who often travel great lengths to assist at them. The dark currents of iconoclasm that run through the history of Walsingham—even to the original statue itself being burned on order of King Henry VIII—must strike us as similar to the war against the beauty of tradition we face in our own day. Truly, Our Lady, who showered so much grace on the people of England through her shrine, only to see its desecration at the hands of the very authorities charged with protecting it, must look with special mercy on us.

In addition to the Walsingham shrine here at the Oratory (opposite of the Marian altar), the Girls' Guild made a banner honoring Our Lady as their patroness. The banner, hand-painted on silk charmeuse by one of the girls and fabricated by guild members and members of the Altar and Rosary Society, goes before the Girls' Guild on processions and special feast days.

The image of Our Lady of Walsingham used for the holy card is a photograph of a specially commissioned illumination done for our Oratory by sacred artist Hildegard Mohr. The illumination was done on calfskin vellum using medieval techniques, pigment, and gold leaf. The layout of the image is based off of a miniature found in the Psalter of Robert de Lisle of England, circa, 1330. Our Lady of Walsingham sits enthroned with the Christ Child in the center. In the side alcoves stand St. Gregory and St. Augustine along with adoring angels.


