FROM THE RECTOR

The feast of the Holy Name of Jesus provides us with the opportunity to celebrate the power of the Name of the Lord. A MESSAGE FROM MSGR. MORRIS

I want to take this opportunity to let the faithful of the Oratory know of some health issues I have. In the early Fall of 2024, I was diagnosed with prostate cancer. It has been caught early enough that no symptoms were present, but blood work revealed the cancer. I have undergone a series of tests to determine the best course moving forward and that decision involves surgery. The surgery is scheduled for 30 January 2025 and will require an overnight stay. I will then spend the next several weeks in recovery. I am hoping that I will be recovered well enough by Ash Wednesday which is 5 March 2025. I am grateful to both Fr. Rennier and Fr. DEVOTION TO THE HOLY FACE OF JESUS - BOOKS

Please accept a copy of "The Secret of the Holy Face" by Fr. Lawrence Carney as a donation to all parishioners available in the vestibule of the Church today. Given the course of events occurring in our country and within the Church, especially with regard to the current growth of Communism, it is recommended that Catholics understand and pray the Holy Face Devotion. This powerful devotion was given to mankind by our Lord and evolved as a weapon to combat the evils of Communism when it first appeared. Though the devotion became less popular, primarily after Vatican II, many Catholics now believe there is an urgent and renewed need for this prayerful exercise given its promises.

Numerous miracles are associated with this devotion which has the full approval of the Catholic Church. In 1843 the Lord spoke these words Sr. Marie de Saint Pierre, a Carmelite nun, in Tours:

"The earth is covered with crimes. The violation of the first three Commandments of God has irritated My Father. The Holy Name of God blasphemed, and the Holy Day of the Lord profaned, filling up the measure of iniquities. These sins have risen into the throne of God and provoked his wrath which will soon burst forth if justice be not appeased. At no time have these crimes reached such a pitch."

In 1845, the Reparative Mystery of the Holy Face was revealed to Sister Saint-Pierre as the Lord stated: "I seek Veronicas to wipe and venerate My Holy Face which has few adorers... and by My Holy Face, you will work many miracles."

The Lord gave Sister Saint-Pierre the Golden Arrow prayer as special reparation for blasphemy. She then prayed the rosary asking Our Lady's intercession in helping her to get the Lord's message to others. Shortly thereafter Mary's apparition at La Salette followed which affirmed the Lord's words to Sister Saint-Pierre, "The Church will be in eclipse."

The revelations to Sister Saint Pierre are also at the foundation of Our Lady's warning at Fatima, regarding the spread of atheistic errors of secular humanism, Socialism, and religious suppression contained in Communism and of revolutionary men.

Please consider studying and praying the Holy Face Devotion for our country and for Holy Mother Church in these challenging times.

WELLSPRING OF TRADITION

EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION OF MOVEABLE FEASTS

Epiphany is the last principal feast before the beginning of the Easter cycle. The *Pontificale Romanum* (*Pars III. De Publicatione festorum Mobilium in Epiphania Domini*) provides rubrics, text, and chant for how to announce the date of Easter and of the main movable feasts of the year on this day. This follows a tradition that dates back to the early days of the Church, when calendars were rare. The Patriarch of Alexandria, where the most skilled Christian astronomers lived, had the mission to send the date of the Paschal solemnity to other Eastern Patriarchs and to the Roman Pontif, who then informed the metropolitans of the West.

The Council of Nicaea is said to have formalized the practice, so that everyone everywhere should celebrate it on one and the same day. Although there is no mention of the fixing of the date of Easter in the canons of the Council of Nicaea which have been preserved, we know that the issue was discussed and decided by the council from various documents published

afterwards. It soon became a practice for bishops to publish annually, on 6 January, an *Epistola festalis*, a pastoral letter in which were announced the dates of Easter and movable feasts of the current year.

Many Fathers of the early Church speak of the announcement of the date of Easter on the feast of the Epiphany. The Fourth Council of Orleans in 541 and that of Auxerre in 578 are good witnesses of this use in Gaul, and broadly, in the West. In the old Parisian Breviary, at the end of the office of a prime, a canon from decisions of the holy councils used to be read on Sundays & holidays. Here's the one for the Epiphany:

The Council, guided by the inspiration of a God full of goodness for men, ruled that the priests will celebrate at the same time the holy Easter, and that every year on the day of Epiphany the people in the church will be informed of this solemn feast... Let the priests before the Epiphany send deputies to the bishop to be informed by him of the beginning of Lent, and to be able to instruct the faithful upon that on the day of Epiphany.

The Parisian and Ambrosian rites have shorter formulae for this announcement. But the Roman rite has a slightly expanded formula, known from its first word as the *Noveritis*. In addition to the date of Easter are also added those of Septuagesima, Ash Wednesday, Ascension, Pentecost and First Sunday of Advent. The Roman chant uses the same melody as the *Exultet* of the Easter Vigil, which gives a taste of the Easter joy to the publication of the date of Easter. This same idea is developed by Dom Prosper Guéranger in his great commentary, *The Liturgical Year*.

This custom, which dates from the earliest ages of the Church, shows both the mysterious connection which unites the great Solemnities of the year one with another, and the importance the Faithful ought to attach to the celebration of that which is the greatest of all, and the center of all Religion. After having honored the King of the universe on the Epiphany, we shall have to celebrate him on the day which is now announced to us, as the conqueror of death.

At the Oratory, we will chant this announcement after the Gospel at all Holy Masses on Sunday 5 January, the day before the feast of Epiphany. Here is the text in Latin and English:

Noveritis, fratres carissimi, quod annuente Dei misericordia sicut de Nativitate Domini Nostri Jesu Christi gavisi sumus, ita et de Resurrectione ejusdem Salvatoris nostri gaudium vobis annuntiamus. Dei sexta decima Februarii erit Dominica in Septuagesima. Quina Martii dies Cinerum et initium jejunii sacratissimae Quadragesimae. Vigesima Aprilis sanctum Pascha Domini nostri Jesu Christi cum gaudio celebrabimus. Nona vigesima Maji erit Ascensio Domini nostri Jesu Christi. Die octa Junii Festum Pentecostes. Nona decima ejusdem Festum sacratissimi Corporis Christi. Trigesima Novembris Dominica prima Adventus Domini nstri Jesu Christi, cui est honor et gloria in saecula saeculorum. Amen.

Know, dearest brethren, by the gift of God's mercy, as we have rejoiced for the birth of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, so also we announce to you joy for the Resurrection of the same Our Savior. On the sixth day of February will be Septuagesima Sunday. On the fifth of March, the day of Ashes, and the beginning of the fast of most holy Lent. On the twentieth of April, we will celebrate with joy the holy Easter of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. On the twenty-ninth of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. On eighth day of June, the feast of Pentecost. On the nineteenth of the same month, the feast of the most holy Body of Christ. On the thirtieth of November, the first Sunday of the Advent of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, to whom are honor and glory forever and ever. Amen."

Our Lady of Walsingham, intercede for us who have recourse to thee!




