CANDLEMAS CELEBRATION: 2 FEBRUARY @ 10:00 am Holy Mass

Sunday, 2 February 2025, we will celebrate the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary traditionally known as Candlemas.

The traditional blessing of candles will take place at the 10:00 am Holy Mass. Candles will be blessed immediately upon the entrance of the sacred ministers. After the blessing of Candles, they will be distributed at the communion rail and then they will be lit by the servers. Weather permitting, we will have an outdoor procession around the Church celebrating the Light of Christ (please dress accordingly). If the weather does not cooperate, our procession will proceed inside of the Church.

The candles can be taken home for your personal spiritual use and there will be more candles available on the Oratory table in the back of Church. Please take only those candles that are needed

The faithful are allowed to bring their own candles for blessing. Candles should be brought only on that day and placed on the tables provided that will be near the altar of the Blessed Mother PRIOR to Holy Mass. Candles should be accessible to be blessed with holy water and be marked clearly with the name of the person/family that is having them blessed. Finally, all candles must be retrieved at the conclusion of Holy Mass. Any candles that are not retrieved at the conclusion of Holy Mass will be distributed by the Oratory. Please call the Oratory with any questions.

A MESSAGE FROM MSGR. MORRIS

I want to take this opportunity to let the faithful of the Oratory know of some health issues I have. In the early Fall of 2024, I was diagnosed with prostate cancer. It has been caught early enough that no symptoms were present, but blood work revealed the cancer. I have undergone a series of tests to determine the best course moving forward and that decision involves surgery. The surgery is scheduled for 27 January 2025 and will require an overnight stay. I will then spend the next several weeks in recovery. I am hoping that I will be recovered well enough by Ash Wednesday which is 5 March 2025. I am grateful to both Fr. Rennier and Fr. Linus who will maintain the liturgical schedule for the Oratory as I will be unable to leave the rectory during my convalescence. Please pray for me and for those doctors and nurses involved in my surgery. Know that during my recovery you will remain in my daily prayers. Let us always have recourse to Our Lady of Walsingham and our patrons, Ss. Gregory and Augustine!

BLESSED ITEMS

Rennier have blessed the items Donna Mueller, Administrative Assistant to the Rector, will call you to let you know the items are ready for pick up (from the rectory office, Mon-Fri, 9am-2pm). Please drop off/pick up items at the front door on Dale Avenue, across from the field parking lot.

Please accept a copy of "The Secret of the Holy Face" by Fr. Lawrence Carney as a donation to all parishioners available in the vestibule of the Church today. Given the course of events occurring in our country and within the Church, especially with regard to the current growth of Communism, it is recommended that Catholics understand and pray the Holy Face Devotion. This powerful devotion was given to mankind by our Lord and evolved as a weapon to combat the evils of Communism when it first appeared. Though the devotion became less popular, primarily after Vatican II, many Catholics now believe there is an urgent and renewed need for this prayerful exercise given its promises.

Numerous miracles are associated with this devotion which has the full approval of the Catholic Church. In 1843 the Lord spoke these words Sr. Marie de Saint Pierre, a Carmelite nun, in Tours:

3rd Sunday after Epiphany

"The earth is covered with crimes. The violation of the first three Commandments of God has irritated My Father. The Holy Name of God blasphemed, and the Holy Day of the Lord profaned, filling up the measure of iniquities. These sins have risen into the throne of God and provoked his wrath which will soon burst forth if justice be not appeased. At no time have these crimes reached such a pitch."

In 1845, the Reparative Mystery of the Holy Face was revealed to Sister Saint-Pierre as the Lord stated: "I seek Veronicas to wipe and venerate My Holy Face which has few adorers... and by My Holy Face, you will work many miracles."

The Lord gave Sister Saint-Pierre the Golden Arrow prayer as special reparation for blasphemy. She then prayed the rosary asking Our Lady's intercession in helping her to get the Lord's message to others. Shortly thereafter Mary's apparition at La Salette followed which affirmed the Lord's words to Sister Saint-Pierre, "The Church will be in eclipse."

The revelations to Sister Saint Pierre are also at the foundation of Our Lady's warning at Fatima, regarding the spread of atheistic errors of secular humanism, Socialism, and religious suppression contained in Communism and of revolutionary men.

Please consider studying and praying the Holy Face Devotion for our country and for Holy Mother Church in these challenging times.

Again, we thank our generous Giving Tuesday donors who made possible the acquisition of our beautiful crèche now housed in the Marian transept and available as a place of prayer until February 3rd. As you make your visits to the crèche in these final days of the Christmas season, perhaps consider the points of reflection below:

Our Crèche - Five Points to Ponder

One - Between the Ox and the Ass

Note the location of the Christ Child, Our Lady, and St. Joseph between the Ox's shed and the Ass's shed. The architect who designed the stable chose this arrangement in order to make quite clear the fulfillment of the famous prophecy in the Book of Habakkuk: "Between two animals you are made manifest." The ox and the ass not only represent the poverty into which Christ plunged Himself, but also the peoples He came to save: Jews symbolized by the Ox, a clean animal, and gentiles symbolized by the Ass, an unclean animal. While today, we see the Holy Family as the three fundamental figures of any Nativity scene, in some early iconography, the ox and the ass were considered even more important depictions than St. Joseph, due to their great symbolic significance.

Two - The Hymn of the Angels

A mighty archangel stands above the manger and a choir of angels flies in the distance behind him after having summoned the shepherds. At each Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we join our voices to the angels of Christmas morning when we sing the Gloria.

Three - Symbols of Epiphany

Although in the recent history of the Church, Christmas has enjoyed more prominence as a feast than Epiphany, in truth, Christmas is but a quiet precursor to the splendor of Christ's manifestation to the world which we celebrate in the Feast of Epiphany. In our crèche here at the Oratory, we have included imagery to remind pious souls of all three of the great scenes included in Christ's manifestation as King. First, we see the Three Magi adoring at the crib and presenting their gifts, a testament to the worship of all lands and nations. Next, we see two clay jars which may call to mind the water jars at cana used by Christ in His first great miracle. And finally, we see a stream, calling to mind Christ's upcoming Baptism in the River Jordan.

Four - Symbols of the Passion

The prominence of wood in the stable building, both in its paneled walls and hayloft of dark angled beams, may call to mind the wood of the Cross. The use of holly from the tree which grows just next to our church reminds us of Christ's crown of thorns and drops of Precious Blood.

Five - A playful Detail

And finally, during installation of the nativity on 23 December, a schola member added rolled oats to the troughs for the ox and the ass lest they grow hungry during the many weeks of Christmas.

Special thanks to Mrs. Erin Turntine, president of the Oratory Altar and Rosary Society for her research which led us to the beautiful Ulrich Nativity figures. And heartfelt gratitude to Mr. Scott Varian, an architect who graciously designed and built our stable *pro bono*. For months prior to the build, he developed his vision for a Northern European structure of graceful asymmetry featuring rich but rustic wood work and authentic thatching. The stable is a most fitting addition to our English Gothic church and will inspire the hearts of young and old for years to come. Deo Gratias!




