FROM THE RECTOR

This last Sunday before Ash Wednesday, the virtue to which the Church draws our attention is faith: choosing to cling to God above all things. In the Old Testament, Abraham is truly our father in faith. He models the required disposition to be in relationship with God trusting in the Lord even when what is asked is beyond our own understanding. Abraham always sought for God and was rewarded for his fidelity becoming the father of many nations. Of course, the fulfillment of this promise to Abraham is Christ who through His Paschal Mystery makes complete the covenant that was established long ago. This relationship of love into which the Triune God draws each of us requires on our part the deliberate and intentional response of faith calling out to Him for mercy and healing. Now, maybe more than ever, faithfulness and fidelity must be the words upon which we build a solid foundation with God. Only God saves us; only God protects and safeguards us; only God makes sense of the world in which we live. It is this failure to trust in God and to live a life of faith that has brought modern man to the place where he now finds himself. In our time, we are waking up from the fog and confusion of a politically correct society that sought through any and all means to eradicate truth especially related to the dignity of the human person. Grateful as we may be for shift in society and culture under this new leadership, as believers we can never allow ourselves to be drawn into a false hope in secular powers. All leaders need to be held accountable and need to be called to faith in Christ and in His Church. As is always true in the spiritual life and the transformation of the world, this accountability begins with each of us. The journey to His cross will reveal our weakness, frailty, and sinfulness. Our faith in God will make it possible for us to cooperate well with Him, overcome our sinful ways, and enjoy the rewards of everlasting life.

**IN THANKSGIVING**

**WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?**

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!

**DEVOTION TO THE HOLY FACE OF JESUS - BOOKS**

Please accept a copy of "The Secret of the Holy Face" by Fr. Lawrence Carney as a donation to all parishioners available

in the vestibule of the Church today. Given the course of events occurring in our country and within the Church, especially with regard to the current growth of Communism, it is recommended that Catholics understand and pray the Holy Face Devotion. This powerful devotion was given to mankind by our Lord and evolved as a weapon to combat the evils of Communism when it first appeared. Though the devotion became less popular, primarily after Vatican II, many Catholics now believe there is an urgent and renewed need for this prayerful exercise given its promises.

Numerous miracles are associated with this devotion which has the full approval of the Catholic Church. In 1843 the Lord spoke these words Sr. Marie de Saint Pierre, a Carmelite nun, in Tours:

*"The earth is covered with crimes. The violation of the first three Commandments of God has irritated My Father. The Holy Name of God blasphemed, and the Holy Day of the Lord profaned, filling up the measure of iniquities. These sins have risen into the throne of God and provoked his wrath which will soon burst forth if justice be not appeased. At no time have these crimes reached such a pitch."*

In 1845, the Reparative Mystery of the Holy Face was revealed to Sister Saint-Pierre as the Lord stated: "I seek Veronicas... and by My Holy Face, you will work many miracles."

The Lord gave Sister Saint-Pierre the Golden Arrow prayer as special reparation for blasphemy. She then prayed the rosary asking Our Lady's intercession in helping her to get the Lord's message to others. Shortly thereafter Mary's apparition at La Salette followed which affirmed the Lord's words to Sister Saint-Pierre, "The Church will be in eclipse."

The revelations to Sister Saint Pierre are also at the foundation of Our Lady's warning at Fatima, regarding the spread of atheistic errors of secular humanism, Socialism, and religious suppression contained in Communism and of revolutionary men.

Please consider studying and praying the Holy Face Devotion for our country and for Holy Mother Church in these challenging times.
