FROM THE RECTOR

Our time of spiritual renewal begins! The Church in Her wisdom provides us the opportunity to contemplate the love of Christ and the mystery of His Cross during the Lenten season. Through intense prayer, fasting, and almsgiving each of us can more completely configure ourselves to the mystery of the Lord's Cross. The work of salvation belongs completely to Christ who invites us to cooperate in His work through our human efforts. As such we should be serious about our Lenten disciplines, not easily excusing ourselves from them. So too, we should take advantage of the sacrament of penance as often as needed. There are a great many temptations that plague us and make it even more difficult for us to subject ourselves to the will of God. Overcoming temptation and sin requires radical and complete trust in the grace of Christ. So too, that profound trust in grace is necessary for us to be configured to Christ crucified. Let us never lose sight of the centrality of the Cross in our spiritual lives. There is no sharing in the victory of Christ unless we are willing to follow Him in the way He went. Even when everyone around us has chosen to go his own way, we must remain steadfast and constant with Christ. The triumph of the Cross is not measured in numbers but manifested through fidelity. The Lord is victorious because of His obedience, and we only share in that victory through obedience to Him. As we journey with Our Lord to the Cross, let us use wisely these days set before us that we might overcome our own weaknesses and find our strength in God alone!

WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!

DEVOTION TO THE HOLY FACE OF JESUS - BOOKS

Please accept a copy of "The Secret of the Holy Face" by Fr. Lawrence Carney as a donation to all parishioners available in the vestibule of the Church today. Given the course of events occurring in our country and within the Church, especially with regard to the current growth of Communism, it is recommended that Catholics understand and pray the Holy Face Devotion. This powerful devotion was given to mankind by our Lord and evolved as a weapon to combat the evils of Communism when it first appeared. Though the devotion became less popular, primarily after Vatican II, many Catholics now believe there is an urgent and renewed need for this prayerful exercise given its promises.

Numerous miracles are associated with this devotion which has the full approval of the Catholic Church. In 1843 the Lord spoke these words Sr. Marie de Saint Pierre, a Carmelite nun, in Tours:

"The earth is covered with crimes. The violation of the first three Commandments of God has irritated My Father. The Holy Name of God blasphemed, and the Holy Day of the Lord profaned, filling up the measure of iniquities. These sins have risen into the throne of God and provoked his wrath which will soon burst forth if justice be not appeased. At no time have these crimes reached such a pitch."

In 1845, the Reparative Mystery of the Holy Face was revealed to Sister Saint-Pierre as the Lord stated: "I seek Veronicas to wipe and venerate My Holy Face which has few adorers... and by My Holy Face, you will work many miracles."

The Lord gave Sister Saint-Pierre the Golden Arrow prayer as special reparation for blasphemy. She then prayed the rosary asking Our Lady's intercession in helping her to get the Lord's message to others. Shortly thereafter Mary's apparition at La Salette followed which affirmed the Lord's words to Sister Saint-Pierre, "The Church will be in eclipse."

The revelations to Sister Saint Pierre are also at the foundation of Our Lady's warning at Fatima, regarding the spread of atheistic errors of secular humanism, Socialism, and religious suppression contained in Communism and of revolutionary men.

Please consider studying and praying the Holy Face Devotion for our country and for Holy Mother Church in these challenging times.
