FROM THE RECTOR

The liturgical celebration of Our Lord's triumphal entrance into Jerusalem along with the first proclamation of the Lord's Passion are set before our eyes today with great simplicity making the experience of them even more profound. The sacred liturgy begins with the blessing of palms and a procession which call to the mind the Lord's joyful entrance into Jerusalem. Our ritual participation draws us into the events that took place over two thousand years ago when our Savior entered His city in order to redeem His people. Holy Mass follows! Now we, the faithful, must confront the sorrow of the Redeemer's Passion and the part our sins have played in the Lord's suffering. Entrance into today's mysteries brings us one step closer to the holiest of days when we celebrate the triumph of life over death and the victory of mercy and sacrifice over selfishness and sin. All of our preparations during this Lenten pilgrimage were undertaken to aid us in not turning away from the horror of the Cross; rather, we have prayed, fasted, and sacrificed in order to rejoice in the victory the Cross brings to each of us. Life entails suffering and even now we are beset with the burdens of sin and sacrifice that overwhelm us. The life of faith calls us to confess that Christ conquers sin, suffering and death upon the Cross once for all. We adore thee O Christ and we bless thee, because by thy holy Cross you have redeemed the world!

The severity of the injuries has varied, but sadly this has occurred far too often. I would ask everyone to be attentive to the step up AND down at the communion rail. Please be aware of those with any mobility issues and assist them if no ushers are present. If you bring someone new to the Oratory for Holy Mass, please remind them of the step at the communion rail or if you see someone struggling, please assist them. If the community is more cognizant of this at the time of communion it is hoped that the accidents can cease. Please pray for those who have fallen, especially for a swift recovery from their injuries.

THE NAMED DAYS OF HOLY WEEK

Most Catholics are familiar with titles for days in Holy Week such as "Palm Sunday" and "Good Friday." But actually, coming from the English Catholic tradition, each day of Holy Week has a special nickname. See the short explanation here:

- Palm Sunday: The day of Our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem celebrated with palm branches.
- Fig Monday: Traditionally the gospel reading for this day was the passage where Our Lord curses the fig tree that does not bear fruit.
- Temple Tuesday: Traditionally the gospel reading for this day was the passage where Our Lord cleanses the temple.
- Spy Wednesday: Because this is the day when Judas (the spy) performed his wicked dealing with the pharisees.
- Maundy Thursday: The day on which we have the custom of the mandatum (the washing of the feet).
- Good Friday: The day of our redemption.
- Holy Saturday: The beginning of the Paschal celebration.

In other languages such as Italian, all of the days of Holy Week simply have the title "Holy" like our Holy Saturday. It is only in English that we find this memorable diversity of nicknames. Here at the Oratory, we thought it a nomenclature worth reviving.

THOUGHTS ON PASSIONTIDE VEILING

From the Gospel of Passion Sunday (John 8 46:59): "They took up stones therefore to cast at Him: but Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple." This reminds us of the humiliation to which Our Lord subjected Himself in hiding from the Pharisees. If the Master's glory is eclipsed, it is but right that the servants (the statues of Our Lady and the Saints) also be so. Thus, they are veiled.

Furthermore, the veiling increases the breathtaking suspense of the great mysteries by carrying on that progressive stripping that takes place in Septuagesima and Lent. In Septuagesima, flowers are no longer used. In Passiontide, the relics are taken away and the statues hidden. Finally, after the Liturgy of Holy Thursday, the altars

themselves (except the altar of repose) are stripped bare to show the desolation of Good Friday.

The crucifixes are unveiled on Good Friday beautifully highlighting the primacy of the Cross for our salvation. Good Friday is the climax, even the crown jewel of the Sacred Triduum. The rest of the statues are unveiled at the Easter Vigil during the Gloria liturgically manifesting the joy of Heaven that has been won for us only through the Cross of Christ and His Crucifixion. OFFICE OF TENEBRAE

"Tenebrae" is the name given to the service of Matins and Lauds belonging to the last three days of Holy Week and normatively anticipated the evening before. These services are marked by a somber and sober, nearly mournful praying of the Divine Office. The structure of the office is sparse, reflecting the seriousness of these sacred days and the sadness that should accompany all of us because Christ our Savior suffered for our sins.

The Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine will have the opportunity to pray Tenebrae on the following evenings:

- Wednesday, 16 April @ 9:00 pm Tenebrae of Holy Thursday
- Thursday, 17 April @ 9:00 pm Tenebrae of Good Friday
- Friday, 18 April @ 9:00 pm Tenebrae of Holy Saturday

This is a solemn and profound way to enter more deeply into the Sacred Triduum and the Paschal Mystery which has brought us our salvation.

HOLY WEEK/OCTAVE OF EASTER

As we move closer to the celebration of the holiest days of the liturgical year, please mark your calendars regarding the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass during Holy Week and the Octave of Easter. HOLY WEEK: The Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week, Holy Mass will only be celebrated at 12:15 pm. In order to accommodate those wanting to go to confession, they will begin at 10:30 am and go until 12 Noon. OCTAVE OF EASTER: The Oratory will celebrate High Mass every day during the Octave of Easter. Everyone is encouraged to attend to truly celebrate well the Resurrection of Our Savior. The schedule will be as follows: (Monday – Friday) Holy Mass will only be celebrated at 12:15 pm with the normal time of 11:00 am for confessions.

WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!

SOCIAL ENGAGEMENTS DURING LENT FOR THE RECTOR

In years past, I have found it spiritually profitable to limit my social engagements during the Lenten season and will do so for this Lenten season as well. Obviously, I am available to the faithful for spiritual counseling and matters related to faith but will limit social engagements and dinners until after the Octave of Easter. If you do need to contact me for any reason, please do not hesitate to email or call. 


