SUMMER SCHEDULE

While this is several months away, to allow the faithful of the Oratory to plan accordingly, the Oratory will again implement the summer schedule. Beginning on Tuesday, 1 July 2025 and concluding on Thursday, 14 August 2025 the Oratory will have one daily Holy Mass at 12:15 pm with Confessions at 11:00 am. The Saturday and Sunday schedules will remain the same. The offices hours during this time will be Monday through Thursday from 8:00 am until 2:30 pm. The offices will be closed on Fridays. In order to assist the priests and the staff, please do not anticipate any parish business on Fridays. These scheduling changes allow the priests of the Oratory to take vacation and more importantly to make their canonical retreats. So too, the changed office hours will allow our dedicated staff time for vacation. As we move closer to the month of July, more information will be provided.

THE COMMUNION RAIL

In recent weeks there have been several incidents where the faithful have fallen from the communion rail after receiving Holy Communion. The severity of the injuries has varied, but sadly this has occurred far too often. I would ask everyone to be attentive to the step up AND down at the communion rail. Please be aware of those with any mobility issues and assist them if no ushers are present. If you bring someone new to the Oratory for Holy Mass, please remind them of the step at the communion rail or if you see someone

struggling, please assist them. If the community is more cognizant of this at the time of communion it is hoped that the accidents can cease. Please pray for those who have fallen, especially for a swift recovery from their injuries.

WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!

WELLSPRING OF TRADITION: Low Sunday, Station at St Pancratius

The first Sunday after Easter is a day with many names. Most English speakers know it as 'Low Sunday.' While the origin of that term is not certain, most agree that the title refers in some way to the contrast between the heightened celebration of the great feast of Easter with its Octave and a return to a more normal Sunday celebration.

The official liturgical name for this day is *Dominica in Albis Depositis*. In the ancient rites of the catechumenate, the newly baptized (the neophytes) were vested in white baptismal robes for their Baptism, Confirmation, and first Holy Mass and Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil. They wore these robes through entire week following, and were guests of honor in the church of their baptism, where they attended Holy Mass each morning and attended a special service at the baptismal font in the afternoon. On the Saturday of Easter week they came to their baptismal church for the last time as a special group. After Holy Mass they removed their white garments and placed them in the church's wardrobe as a reminder of their baptismal vows. Hence this Saturday is called *Sabbato in albis*, or 'Saturday in white (robes)' and the following day is *Dominica in albis depositis*, 'Sunday on which the white robes have been put away.' On this Sunday they joined the faithful for Holy Mass without their white garments for the first time as all marched to the final stational church of Easter, St. Pancratius, named for a young man who was martyred at age 14 for being baptized.

Yet another name for this day is *Pascha clausum* or 'Easter's end', referring to the fact that today is actually the Octave Day of Easter. But the use of that particular Latin word to mark the conclusion of the Easter Octave has a deeper meaning. We find *clausum* in today's gospel, where it describes the closed doors of the Upper Room where the Risen Lord appeared to the disciples, minus S Thomas, and then appeared again to demolish S Thomas's doubts and claim his faith in the Risen Lord. In the liturgy, the Octave actually ends with the double *Alleluia* at the end of None on the Saturday, because we began our celebration on Saturday at the Vigil. On this day we begin the season of Paschaltide.

In many places, it is commonly known as *Quasimodo* Sunday. Like *Gaudete* and *Laetare* Sundays, this name is used because of the opening words of today's Introit, *Quasimodo geniti infantes*, (1 Pet 2:2), which refers to the neophytes who have just laid aside their white baptismal robes. A newborn child, with its instinct of self-preservation, desires its mother's milk. It needs no admonitions. We also, in order to preserve the supernatural life, should have a spontaneous longing for the nourishment of our souls, for truth, and for the Holy Eucharist. Like a mother, the Church cries out to us: Preserve the spirit of the children of God, remain simple, humble, and submissive to Him. Remain *rationabiles*, mature enough to think clearly, and *sine dolo*, able to preserve the truth without falsity, and to love without envy. And yes, this is also the reason for the name of Victor Hugo's famous hero in *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*, who was discovered as an abandoned baby on this day.
